1 Announcement

Oxford Motor Club will promote a dual permit Autosolo and PCA on Sunday 22nd June 2014, at MOD Arncott, Bicester, Oxfordshire.

2 Jurisdiction

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of The Motorsports Association (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions issued by Oxford Motor Club, including notices posted on the official notice board.

5 Eligibility

The event is open to all members of clubs in,

- Club Triumph
- CSMA
- South East Lotus Owners Club (SELOC)
- ACSMC

6 Championship

The event will be a qualifying round of CMSGCC Autosolo Championship, ASWMC Autosolo Championship, BTRDA Autosolo Championship and BTRDA Autosolo Challenge.

7 Entries

The entry list opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes on Wednesday $18^{\rm th}$ June 2014.

The entry fee is **£35.00** for the Autosolo and **£30.00** for the PCA. There are two ways to enter and pay,

Oxford Motor Club Membership is available and valid until the end of December 2014 at £12.00 per competitor. All entries must be made on the official Entry Form and accompanied by the appropriate fee. Entries will be acknowledged by email or phone. The Entries Secretary where all entries must be sent is:

The maximum number of starters for the event will be 45. The minimum is 30.

Entries will be selected on a **first come, first served basis**. Cancellations must be made in writing to the Entries Secretary either by post or E-mail and must be received before the entry list closes on 18th June 2014. In such cases the entry fee will be refunded. For cancellations after the closing date, refunds will be at the discretion of the organisers.

If the event is cancelled for any reason, entry fees will be refunded less any unavoidable expenses.

Final Instructions will be emailed during the week prior to the event and on the web-site.

8 Classes

The minimum for each class is 5 and, if that number is not reached, we reserve the right to amalgamate classes as necessary. State either Nat B or Clubmans on entry form.

Class A. Series Production Cars – Saloons up to 1400cc

Class B. Series Production Cars – Saloons 1401cc to 2000cc

Class C. Series Production Cars – Saloons over 2000cc

Class **D**. Series Production Sports Cars – including MX5, Lotus Elise, Vauxhall VX220.

Class **E**. Any other Road Legal car not eligible for classes A to D. (Caterham, Westfield, etc.)

Class F: PCA – Open only to 14 – 16 year olds.

Petrol engined cars with forced induction in classes A and B will move up one capacity class. Rotary engined cars will be classed at 1.5 times their nominal capacity. Diesel cars with or without forced induction will run in the class corresponding to their engine capacity.

In classes A to D, cars must retain the original panel and window materials although additional panels such as wheel arch extensions are permitted. Cars in these classes must have full trim and seats, although trim may be changed. Also in classes A to D, the engine must be of original manufacture and original basic type and must be fitted in the original position. The engine may be modified and may be of a different capacity provided that the car is entered in the class corresponding to its actual capacity. Cars not meeting these requirements are eligible for Class E only.

9 Signing On

All competitors on the event must produce a valid membership card.

Those competitors' who are members of CMSG clubs but who don't have CMSGCC membership cards will be issued with them on completion of the membership form on the day. CMSG Autosolo Championship registration is £5.00.

10 Scrutineering

All vehicles must comply with MSA Technical Regulations. All vehicles must be **taxed** and insured for the public road. A current MOT certificate must be produced at **scrutineering**: exemption can only be given to vehicles less than three years old (MOT), and then proof of date of first registration will be required.

Tyres from List 1B are not permitted. A list of these tyres is printed within these regulations.

All vehicles must have been driven to the event via the public highway.

11 Test's

The event will consist of at least 4-test layouts applied to one test area. Time will be allowed to walk the course before the start of each test.

12 Timing and Timecards

Timing will be by clocks held by marshals at the Start and Finish. Timing will be in Minutes Seconds and fractions of a Second $(1/10^{th})$.

14 Programme of the Meeting

Scrutineering will start at 07:45 and close at 09:00. Anyone not signed-on by 0900 may not be allowed to start. Drivers briefing at 0905. First test will start at approx.0910, with an estimated finish about 17.30. There will be a short break for lunch after test 2.

Competitors will be split into 3 groups.

15 Results and Awards

Provisional Results will be made available shortly after the end of the event and will be declared final as soon as possible thereafter. Protests and Queries must be lodged in accordance with C 5.1 to 5.7

Awards will be presented as follows:-

First Overall	FTD
First in each Class	
Second in each Class	(subject to 6 starters).

No competitor may win more than one award.

16 Food, Toilets & Fuel

• The Garrison canteen will be able to provide food for competitors and officials during the event. Breakfast will be available on the morning and hot or cold meals will be available during the lunch break.

- Toilets will be provided.
- Water is available but no fuel, the nearest garage is in Bicester.

17 Rally Security Protocols

IMPORTANT: PLEASE READ & ACTION IN ADVANCE OF EVENT

Event HQ, Scrutineering and Documentation are located within a secure Ministry of Defence facility. As a result, all competitors, marshals, officials and event personnel will need to be aware of and adhere to strict security protocols in order to gain access to the venue throughout the day.

17.1 Prior to the event, all competitors, marshals and other personnel known to be attending the event will be sent a security details form by the Organisers. This form needs to be completed in advance by **everyone in your party** who will attend.

17.2 On the day of the event, all personnel will need to bring their completed security form <u>and</u> photographic identification with them in the form of a passport, photo driving licence, MSA licence or another nationally recognised form of photo ID.

17.3 Upon arriving at the base, all event personnel and competitors will be met by members of the organising team outside the security gates and issued with security and vehicle passes which will be valid for the duration of the event.

18 Official Photographer, Photography & Video Restrictions IMPORTANT: PLEASE READ

The Ministry of Defence have requested that no photography from the event be published without their prior consent. This is due to the potential for sensitive information from within a secure facility to be made publically available. The term 'published' includes any publication in a printed form, on the web or via social media.

For these reasons, we request that no photographs or video footage are to be taken on MOD land during the event. Any breach of this instruction may result in the offender being asked to leave the venue by either military personnel or by the Organisers. The ONLY exception to this request will be in the case of an incident where evidential photographs are required by event officials. Such photographs or footage should be taken by event officials only

19 Penalties

The following penalties will be applied.

Maximum time is the quickest time in class for that course, plus 30 seconds.

a) Not reporting at signing on	Exclusion
b) Not reporting at a time control in reasonable time	+ 10 seconds
c) Taking an incorrect route on any course. (however, returning to the point of departure from the correct route and then completing the correct route, no penalty other than exceeding maximum time)	Maximum time
d) Striking a direction barrier	+ 5 seconds
e) Striking a cone or pylon	+ 5 seconds
f) Missing a run on a test	Maximum time
g) Not completing a full marshalling stint	Exclusion

About Autosolo's

An Autosolo consists of a number of timed, all forwards tests, on hard surfaces.

The cars used must be roadgoing and driven to the event. The courses don't require special maneovres like spin or J turns and their design and marking are intended to make the routes easy to follow.

Compared to normal autotest speeds tend to be a little higher and the test's will be longer. Cars will start at timed intervals and there will be two or more cars on the course at the same time. Competitors also act as course marshals on a rotating basis.

Some tips for first timers,

- Increasing tyre pressures by 5-10 psi will help with turn in and reduce wear.
- Always wear a seat belt. You will go faster.
- Learn the course. Don't go flat out out and make a mistake on the first run.
- If you make a mistake drive the rest of the course properly. You are still learning
- Talk to regular competitors for advice.
