President's Mid Term Report

This time last year, we attached a copy of the annual accounts. Due to many various factors, we are unable to send them to you in this edition of BTRDA News, but they will be enclosed with the Autumn Edition.

Our two Rally Championships, the Protyre MSA Asphalt Championship and the Jordan Road Surfacing BTRDA Rally Championship account for well over 50% of our members and I am delighted to say that we have had some great news over the past few weeks.

The MSA have at last, after a lot of lobbying, announced that the running order on gravel events can revert back to what it was, in other words we can put the small 1400cc, Rally First, and Cat 1 Historic cars at the front of the field. Of course we cannot expect to find lots of extra entries immediately, but it will help a lot and I can see more support for the Championships next year. It will help also to batch similar cars together which helps a lots to create the ambience we built up over so many years so that we can have more Serious Fun.

I can also say that the MSA are revisiting the regulations regarding seats and seat belts and I very much hope that we shall hear some news in the next few weeks. They are also putting on hold the introduction of Tracking for vehicles on Stage Rallies, as further in-car systems to those already announced are being looked at and a further announcement should be made by the end of the year.

The Protyre MSA Asphalt Rally Championship has had a great start for the revamped series and my special thanks go to Jane Evans who has worked tirelessly to get it up and running. We have over 100 registrations with mostly full entries on events, in fact the new one day rally in N.Ireland, the Carryduff Forklift Down Rally in July was full within two days! I am going over for this one and it should be special. It will be great to see our National Competitors against the locals...but I somehow think that it is being put on as an excuse to have a great big party, I cannot wait. I am so pleased it is going well, and there is no doubt that we have already learned a few thing to improve the Championship for next year.

Although not in our Championship may I say "well done" to Gary Nichols and his team for putting on the first closed road rally in England, the Clacton Rally in April. We shall be talking to the organisers to see if they want to be considered for the series next year, but personally I think they could do without the pressure of a National Championship, but we shall see, I am often wrong!

Out other Championships all seem to be doing well. Sporting Trials are on holiday at the moment. We have seen an increase in registrations for Rallycross. Autotest remain as competitive as ever and the Autosolo numbers are up, and finally may I say well done to Board Director Neil Mackay who has returned to winning ways in the Car Trial Championship. Finally, for those who want to plan ahead, we have just confirmed the date and venue for out AGM and Prize presentation Luncheon for 2019. It will be held at the Drayton Manor Park Hotel on **SUNDAY 03 FEBRUARY 2019**. More details will be announced in the next editon of BTRDA News.

Protyre MSA Asphalt Rally Championship

Sisson leads Protyre MSA Asphalt Rally Championship at mid-distance

It's been an exciting start to the new-look Protyre MSA Asphalt Rally Championship, with well over 100 registered competitors and three different winners from the first three rounds. At mid-distance, it's Wayne Sisson/Max Freeman who top the overall drivers' and co-drivers' points tables in their B14 class leading Mitsubishi Lancer Evo X.

The experienced Carnforth driver has been consistently fast in the first part of the season, finishing seventh on the opening Melvyn Evans Motorsport Tour of Epynt, third on the Bet On Aces Manx National and fifth on the Rally van Wervik – to give him an 18 point lead. The immaculately prepared Evo hasn't missed a beat either, so it's a well-deserved position at the head of the table.

Jason Pritchard led the series after winning the Manx National in his North Road Garage Focus WRC05, but early clutch problems saw him retire his Fiesta S2000 in Belgium and he and co-driver Phil Clarke slip to second. However, with five scores from six rallies to count, the Builth Wells man's title challenge is still very much on.

Illness forced Daniel Harper to miss the opening event, but since then he's been flying in his Minisport-run John Cooper Works Mini WRC. Co-driven by Chris Campbell, he finished second on the Manx and, after a ragged start, came home third in Belgium to be third in the overall points table.

A very impressive Belgian rally debut saw Barry Groundwater/Neil Shanks climb to fourth in the series in their Groundwater Lift Trucks/AMS-backed Mitsubishi Lancer Evo X – the Aberdeen driver finishing just seven seconds behind Harper in Wervik after another great run. Groundwater is also second in the B14 class, 15 points behind Sisson.

Adrian Spencer started the season well with fifth on Epynt, but retirement on the Manx saw his RED Industries Subaru Impreza WRC have a major rebuild in time for Wervik. It was well worth it, for he and co-driver Matt Daniels took sixth, with the little help from spectators pushing them out of a ditch, to hold fifth place after three rounds.

A Belgian ditch has been the only hiccup in an otherwise sensational start to the season for Phil

Turner, who was third overall going into Wervik. Ripping the front right wheel clean off on SS2 wasn't exactly the plan and it's dropped Phil and co-driver Ian Meakin down to sixth overall, although Race their Toovey Engines/ST Motorsportbacked Escort Mk2 is still the best-placed two-wheel drive car and also leads the B11 class.

Richard and Pat Egger are second in the B11 class in their Highland Cottage Vauxhall Nova. They missed the opening round as Richard was recovering from a skiing accident, but since then they've been flying in

their home-built pocket rocket. Paul and Julian Doroszczuk are third in class after also scoring well twice in their normally-aspirated Cosworthengined Drockspeed Motorsport Escort Mk2, with a broken clutch in Belgium their only retirement.

Kevin Harbour/Dave Tortoishell lead the B10 class in their Dovebank Motors Citroen C2R2. They're in a close battle with Roger Priestnall/Jamie Forrest, who were leading the

class until they put their Proton Satria S1600 into a ditch near the end of Wervik. Dai Roberts. is third in class, after an inspired victory on the Manx in his Peugeot 205 GTI. Mike Pugsley/Stuart Powell led B12 in their Escort Mk1, while Tim Waters leads B13 in his Renault Clio V6. That's quite an achievement, for it's Tim's first rally season after a break of more than 16 years, and he is being co-driven by his son Jack, who is enjoying his first ever season of competition. Steve Retchless/Sasha Heriot are second in B13, 12 points behind Waters. despite their stage rally crashing Escort Mk2 on the Manx and rebuilding their road-rally spec Mk2 for Belgium, thus keeping their title hopes alive.

Jerseyman Ed Fossey heads the R2 class, despite using two different co-drivers and two different Peugeot 208 R2s driving his own on Epynt and hiring a car locally in Belgium. Bill Paynter/Andy Hollingham lead the 1400C class in their Hilka-backed Peugeot Rallye, in spite of a few brake problems on the Manx, while Lloyd Morgan/Marc Clatworthy lead the 1400S category in Euro Tech Roofing/Dynamic Fluidsbacked Nissan Micra, despite a very late retirement in Belgium.

With six Asphalt Rally Championship titles under his belt, Damian Cole started the 2018 season as was one of the favourites. Co-driven by Jamie Edwards, it's only been bad luck since he finished second on Epynt, with suspension problems on the Isle of Man and a bad misfire in Belgium forcing his Get Connected Ford Fiesta WRC out twice and leaving him down in 16th place.

Melvyn Evans won the opening round and with 30 points on the board could put himself right back into title contention in the second half of the season. Also driving a Subaru Impreza WRC S11 is Bob Fowden, who had high hopes of title success in his 40th year competing in rallying, until a fire severely damaged the engine bay of his Comline Auto Parts/NGK-backed car.

Chris Rice/Charley Sayer-Payne were fourth overall after two rounds in their TAS Motorsport Subaru Impreza — a great achievement because, despite running in class B14, it is basically a Group N car with a six-speed gearbox. Chris Ford/Neil Colman have also been going well in their ex-Chris Atkinson Century Hose backed Subaru Impreza WRC S11.

The Protyre MSA Asphalt Rally Championship live streaming service has been a huge success,

with the first three rounds receiving hundreds of thousands of views – thanks to some fantastic stage-side camera work by the Special Stage TV team and superb commentary from Howard Davies. Highlights have also been broadcasted on Motorsport TV, on Front Runner and on the Motor Trend On Demand channel, as well as on the Special Stage Facebook, YouTube and App platforms.

Round 4 of the Protyre MSA Asphalt Rally Championship is the Carryduff Folklift Down Rally on Saturday 21 July. The series then visits the Old Forge Garage Mewla Rally for the penultimate round on 25/26 August, before finishing on the Keldine Autos Cheviot Stages Rally on 28 October.

GATHERING NUTS IN.... APRIL!...

Rejoining the Jordan Road Surfacing BTRDA Rally Series® for the first time in more than a quarter of a century, the Rallynuts Stages (or 'Severn Valley' for those with longer memories!) took contenders to the Royal Welsh Agricultural Showground in Builth Wells in mid-April. The event provided Matt Edwards/Darren Garrod with the opportunity to take their first outright BTRDA Series victory and, just to prove it was no flash in the pan, they repeated the exercise on the Plains Rally a month later! The most recent event since the last update, the ATL Carlisle Stages, saw them grappling with power steering problems which afflicted their Fiesta for much of the day but, struggling manfully on, they brought the recalcitrant car home in 2nd place to add another healthy bag of points to their two maximums.

Notwithstanding, they still trail Paul Bird/Jack Morton whose Focus WRC took maximum points on the opening round of the season, the Cambrian Rally, before a couple of 3rd places on both the Rallynuts and Plains Rallies. Then, on Penrith-based Bird's 'home' event, the Carlisle Stages, local knowledge was put to good use (not to mention Edwards' problems!) to see the British Superbike Team boss record his first outright victory of the season.

2017 Gold Star Champions Stephen Petch/Michael Wilkinson have made it perfectly plain that they are out to put their names on the trophy for a second straight year. Solid runs on the first three events kept them in touch with the

Championship leaders and their Fiesta was actually leading the Carlisle Stages until it left the road during a rainstorm of biblical proportions that caused havoc to any number of competitors on the penultimate stage of the day. They did actually regain the road after a significant delay but there was something amiss underneath the Fiesta, leading them to call it a day at that point. Dropped scores come into play after the next round and that can have the effect of levelling the playing field - however, everybody with designs on the 2018 Gold Star Championship still has a significant amount of work to do before the end of term!

Fiesta converts for this year, Luke Francis/John H Roberts put their Cambrian DNF behind them to take 2nd places on both the Rallynuts and Plains Rallies but, in the style of Jaws, just when they thought it was safe They got caught in Edwards' dust as he grappled with his understeering car on the long run through Newcastleton on the Carlisle Stages and ended up in a ditch. Once extricated, the undamaged car was driven back to the finish, but it was game over for them. Also experiencing the delights of a Fiesta this season, Sacha Kakad/James Aldridge fared somewhat better than the North Walians to tale 5th in Carlisle but the similarity with the two crews is that they now look to Round 5 with just two scores to their names. It's still possible to end the season smelling of roses but any mistakes on the remaining events from either of them and the

odour will be much less fragrant!

Charlie Payne retired from 4th place in Carlisle, planting his Fiesta upside down and perilously close to where Petch's similar car was resting, while Hugh Hunter and Julian Reynolds have both missed the last couple of events and must now consider themselves rank outsiders in terms of this year's title.

Having taken maximum scores in Class B13 in their Impreza on the first two events of the season, Dylan Davies/Llion Williams have left the others to get on with it. In spite of planting their Escort

















Cosworth off the road on the Plains, lan Joel/Graeme Wood are currently enjoying seeing their names in lights at the top of their respective tables, while Matthew Hirst/Declan Dear (Lancer EVO9) are keeping them honest.

Following Tom Naughton/Will Rogers' big accident on the Plains which will see them sidelined for a while, the main protagonists in the BTRDA Production Cup® are defending champions Russ Thompson/Andy Murphy and former champions Pat Naylor/lan Lawrence! Thompson came out on top on the first three events while Naylor, who also retired from the Rallynuts Stages, maintained the upper hand in Carlisle. As we've said before, there's still a way to go but, with three maximums and a second on the board already, Thompson currently has the upper hand. Jon Ross/Martin Auskerin were absent from Carlisle, while we haven't seen Dan Moss/Sam Allen since the Rallynuts....

The MRF Fiesta ST Trophy, to give it its full and correct title, has produced different winners on each of the four rounds to date. Hughes/Tom Wood, James Giddings/Sion Cunniff, Kalvin Green/Osian Owen and, most recently, Ewan Tindall/Paul Hudson have all had some lukewarm sparkling wine to spray over each other and, if extremely unlucky, been forced to taste some well!... Giddings/Cunniff's other scores see them at the top of the table, but Tindall's campaign only started on the Plains because, prior to that, he wasn't old enough to hold a driving licence.....

In terms of numbers, the Jordan Road Surfacing Silver Star® Championship is extremely healthy - thus far 68 drivers have scored points but, that aside, we've had some real giant-killing performances by those standing on the podium at various times. Once again, each round has produced a different winner - following John Rowlands/Glenn Latham (Escort) on the Cambrian, Rob Dennis/Andy Boswell came up trumps in their similar car on the Rallynuts, then it was leuan Rowlands/Emyr Hall in their (Barry Jordan) loaned Avenger on the Plains and, finally, George Lepley/Tom Woodburn's R2 Fiesta that saw off all-comers in Carlisle.

The runners-up points have been spread far and wide as well - Chris Powell/Jim Lewis (1400cc Sunbeam), Owen McMackin/Lee Taylor (Escort), Max Utting/Mike Ainsworth (Fiesta ST Max - fancy having a car named after you!) and, following an unfortunate end to their outing on the Plains, Bob Vardy/Keaton Williams came back fighting to put their Fiesta R2 into 2nd spot in Carlisle. Consistency sees Rob Dennis as the current leader from George Lepley and Andy Davison whose rapid (at least it is the way he drives it!) Talbot Sunbeam VXR took yet another class win in Kielder.

Prior to the Plains Rally, Ernie Graham/Robin Kellard (Escort) were making the BTRDA Historic Cup® all their own, while Tom Coughtrie (Mitsubishi Galant VR4) was doing likewise in the newly-instigated Class H4. However, both cars didn't see the finish in Welshpool but then, a month later, normal service was resumed in

Carlisle, with Ernie & Robin also gracing the Silver Star podium...

While discussing the main twowheel drive elements of the BTRDA Rally Series, it would be rude not to mention the exploits - not to mention the unstinting support - of Barry Jordan himself. While Ernie Graham was having issues on the Plains, BJ kept his head and came away with a maximum of his own, but then Kielder got the better of him when the Avenger waited until the final stage before throwing the towel in!

















The inaugural BTRDA Rallye R2 Cup has seen 14 drivers dip in and out of it so far but, be that as it may, George Lepley/Tom Woodburn (Fiesta) are treating it as if there's no-one else about. Four wins from four starts sees them tantalisingly close to winning the free run on Wales Rally GB through the 'Road to Wales' scheme. The timing is such that the award will be made to the R2 Cup leader after the Woodpecker Stages at the beginning of September and, while Will Graham, Bob Vardy and Tony Simpson are still in a position to ultimately influence the destination of the prize, they need to keep the pressure up in order to do so!

We should, perhaps, mention that the reason Jack Leese/Sam Spencer are not included in the list is that they are presently recovering from a huge accident on the Plains. Jack needed surgery on a broken leg and we wish him a speedy recovery and look forward to seeing him out and about again as soon as his body allows it!

Unless you've been on Mars for a while, you'll be aware that the MSA has recently relaxed its ruling in regard to the running order on events. The Carlisle Stages was the first to benefit from this but, with the best will in the world, it's going to be next season at the earliest before we can gauge just how our 1400 & Rally First Championships will be affected. Nevertheless, it's encouraging that our constant prodding along with that from a number of other agencies has finally borne fruit!

Now, where were we? Ah, yes - the BTRDA 1400 Championship. Chris Powell/Jim Lewis are the only crew with two maximums but, having shone on those events, their Talbot Sunbeam is still prone to the occasional aberration! Fastest 1400 on the opening stage in Carlisle, it then began to suffer with electrical gremlins which affected the fuel pump. They pulled up to see if they could suss out what was wrong and took a maximum in the process. They got going again but, to cut a long story short, they eventually arrived back in Carlisle as last classified finishers!...

Dave & Toby Brick lead the series in their Corsa, from Powell/Lewis, but there was a new face on the winner's rostrum in Carlisle. Tommi

Meadows had forsaken his Ka for an R2 Fiesta on the Plains but reappeared in the 1400 for the Carlisle Stages and, with the help of Emma Morrison, won the category by 40s from the Suzuki Swift of Steve Black.

Kieran Darrington's rehabilitation continued with a third consecutive finish and now, with three rounds remaining, the Top Six drivers are separated by a mere 11 points. To use an old Fleet Street expression, this one will 'run and run'!

Matthew Baddeley leads the BTRDA Rally First® Championship in his VW Lupo from the Nissan Micra of Owen McConochie/Rhodri Williams, while Andrew Wheatley's Puma and the MG ZR of Richard Ingleby both have maximums to their credit. Unfortunately, Wesley Gilford's attempt at taming Kielder was unsuccessful after his Fiesta ST slid off into one of those infamous ditches on the penultimate stage. Better luck next time....

Following the enforced cancellation of the Malcolm Wilson Rally, the MAXXIS MSA English Rally Championship finally set sail on the Carlisle Stages. Open, once again, to all vehicles complying with the current MSA Technical Regulations, the class-based series always has joint leaders after the opening round and a glance at the points table indicates that driving a Ford of some denomination is desirable at this stage.... Ernie Graham (Escort), George Lepley (Fiesta R2), Paul Bird (Focus WRC), Tommi Meadows (Ka) and lan Joel (Escort Cosworth) will have to wait until the Nicky Grist Stages for the opportunity to gain ground on their rivals and claim too soot for themselves....

Indeed, the Nicky Grist Stages is next on the agenda for both BTRDA Rally Series and MSA English Rally Championship contenders and all roads will lead back to the Royal Welsh Showground in Builth Wells on 14th July...

LOW DOWN TORQUE

After the disappointing loss of the wonderful Burton Dasset country park site near Gaydon, the club decided to try a return to an earlier popular site at Long Compton. This is a big site offering great variation in terrain and ground surfaces. Wet weather had been followed by a short dry warm spell so there were a variety of ground conditions from bone dry to soggy bits in shady nooks.

A good number of Championship contenders were there with a nicely balanced split between the three classes - 7, 8 and 7 respectively. Dave Oliver was CoC and laid out 8 hills. This is usually the number of hills these days, mainly because of the difficulty in getting marshals for more than that number.

After my success in the 'experimental' Fiat Seicento on the lyinghoe trial, I brought it out

again to see whether my inaugural win was a fluke or not. Setting the early pace in the morning with clear points advantages were Shawn Franklin in this Saxo in Class 1, Ray Jacobs in his Saxo in Class 2 and Mark Hoppe in his Dutton in Class 3. Mark had put a lot of effort recently into improving the Dutton and the results were looking good. But at this stage this year, he had still not been up against Imp aces Dave and Steve, both officiating on the event.

A pleasant lunch break in the warm spring sunshine ensued when notes were exchanged over comebacks from Rich Harrison in a very smart

red Mark 1 Golf GTi, Bill Moffatt in a 'classics' style Scimitar SS1 and Garry Preston in an Italian Fiat 127. Others fettled ailing cars and Bill decided to retire the SS1 because of terminal electrical problems. Nick Pollitt was excited about his impending trip to Amsterdam and was enquiring about the translation of various 'tourist' phrases.

With all hills altered to some degree, we set off for the afternoon rounds in hot conditions. The changes resulted in higher scores for most in round three and forced the retirements of Garry Preston and Ray Jacobs, Garry with a drivebelt gone and Ray with transmission problems I think. Ray's retirement allowed Rupert North in the Mini to take the lead Class 2, and the net low scores endemic in Class three saw Mark consolidate his overall lead position. Drying

conditions and only minor alterations in round four saw penalties tumble allowing the class leaders to hold on to their positions. John Charles in his Liege dropped only one point on this round, equalling Mark's score – but it was too late! Mark's effort bore fruit and he took the Overall win in the improved Dutton! He was delighted, deservedly. This left Kevin Roberts to inherit the Class 3 award with lan Nute in second. Shawn Franklin won Class 1 followed by Henry Kitching then me. Class 2 was won by Rupert North followed by Phil Buckle and Simon Harris.

It was an excellent trial, with well thought out and variable hills on a familiar old venue. Many thanks to Dave, Steve and Steve and all the marshals.

Matthews Auto Salvage Trial, Sunday May 27th, Anglesey

After good weather on the Bala event on Saturday, our annual trip to Anglesey was threatened to be a wet one. As it turned out this was partially true, with overnight rain making the conditions somewhat moist when we arrived. However, the rain stayed away until the start of Rd 5 and proved to make a miserable and wet finish to the event.

The team had laid out 5 traditional trials hills and one hybrid "autotrial" timed section. Enjoyable but not universally accepted as a purist trial section.

The hills were well thought out in the main and used the limited elevation to good effect. Hill 1 was the timed section, mainly flat but becoming tricky at the end where a mistake would still cost you a nasty 12 points. Rule of thumb....completion is better than a 12. Barrie Parker was the star on this section all day, using the little Fiat to great effect to be fastest on each

round. Thus earning the new nickname of Super Bario.

Hill 2 required a swift approach and then some well timed float across the camber. This was a hill that caused some dilemma and saw a mixture of lines used by the later cars to avoid the now well worn area where acceleration was needed. The top drivers had mixed results on this hill. showing how tricky it was.

Hill 3 looked simple.....a straight climb up the steepest part of the venue, with the soft ground and cattle trodden areas making it very bumpy, finding a mixture of speed and grip made it a challenge, particularly for the fwd classes. Generally most drivers had a good attempt, with most having at least one clean during the day.

Hill 4 was a technical hill with a climb, a drop, a cross camber and a straight climb challenging all. The slippery conditions making the climb and cross camber very tricky to get any

acceleration from. The scoring here was tough and not one clear from all 24 competitors!

Hill 5 was the toughest hill of the day with a tricky climb into a bowl, the choice of staying high (and sliding off) or going low and not getting up the wall of the bowl....at which point you still only had a 7! Then some downhill and very tricky and tight climbs back to the top. Mark Hoppe gained valuable points in round 1 as the only driver to get out of the first bowl and end with a 2.

Hill 6 was a sharp climb from the start with a steep drop and an instant 180 degree turn up and onto

a rutted sharp climb. Drivers were just scraping a 2 in the best conditions, but the 2nd change of direction was very challenging to get right.

The marshals kept the hills lively with minor changes each round and were well managed and marshalled. However these did not impact the main positions and it was Mark Hoppe who came out on top in the Dutton Melos - making it a double for the weekend, and 3 overalls in a row this season.

Class 1 was dominated by Henry Kitching, who was just short on index to topple Hoppe.

Class 2 saw a good win for Garry Preston in his troublesome Fiat and Class 3 was awarded to Dick Glossop after an enjoyable day in the Liege - especially when sliding around the speed test. Special mention to Kev Roberts who would have

Scorer's Snippets 11th June 2018

After the aborted start to our championship year, it is pleasing to report that the rest of the championship is proceeding as planned. Woolbridge Motor Club did a fantastic job in rearranging their Golden Springs event to just three weeks later after the snow postponement, and although a couple of entries (including me) weren't able to make the new date, most competitors gathered for an excellent day near Crewkerne. Falcon Motor Club, it must be pointed out, boasted a full 50 car entry for their lyinghoe Trial in April – it's many a year since entries have been turned away from a Car Trial or PCT.

Coventry & Warwickshire MC resurrected the Long Compton site for the Warwickshire Trial (having lost Burton Dassett to DEFRA's new 'anti-motor sport stance) and the site appears to be virtually unchanged since our last visit. Both events at the May Welsh weekend had increased entries, and although the Wyre Forest organisers were looking at very meagre numbers until late in the day, eight entries appeared on the closing date and at least one more after it! Why do people enter so late – especially after what happened last year when the event was cancelled because of lack of entries? So unnecessary.

We're roughly half way through the championship and a few trends are emerging. Mark Hoppé has got his Melos working well this year, with four crested spoons to show for it. Barrie Parker sprung a surprise (well, not really, as he's good in anything) by trundling out a new Fiat 600 and beating everybody. Shawn

Franklin has upped his game in response and their battle will intensify as the season progresses, no doubt. Dick Glossop has hit the BTRDA ground running, after many years in the Cotswold Championship (twice winning it) in various Beetles and now in his immaculate Liege. John Charles is also doing well in his similar car. Neil Mackay and Garry Preston have class winning cars – if they can get them to the end of the event....... The Imp drivers have only been out a couple of times so far this year – they can't be being put off by the Melos can they? And I need to reduce my Historic Rallying, Solo, Road Rallying and organisational commitments and get out trialling more.

In the Silver Star® championship, Trevor Moffatt has a lead, but Kevin Roberts isn't too far behind, with Neil Mackay and Steve Courts hanging back for bets. It could be close with John Wadsworth and Dave Walker in the mix too.

In Bronze Star®, Dick Glossop has a fair lead, but John Charles isn't far behind. Ifan Roberts and Richard Harrison might have a hand in things yet too.

The championship scores are on the BTRDA website – and they are usually updated by noon the day after an event. They are also displayed at most events – the ones I go to anyway! Alternatively, I can e-mail you a copy if so desired; contact details are inside the front cover of this News.

In my scribble for the last News I complained that we had the worst start to a trials year in living memory due to the wet weather, and I speculated that the Hagley Club's Geoff Taylor Trial at Church Stretton would be cancelled, which proved to be correct. The landowner told Pat Henson, who discovered the site, that he could not even cross it using his quad bike.

The last wet trial this spring was the JB Taylor at Crewkerne in Somerset, which was as well organised as we expect from the local Veale family, they attracted 29 entries, which is good given the relatively long distance to the event for most drivers. It was only by dint of Herculean efforts by the Veales during the week that it managed to run at all, the normal parking area was completely inaccessible, so another landowner was recruited to provide a field for the paddock, which necessitated a short cross country to access the trials site itself, a praiseworthy effort indeed.

Things improved rapidly after that, and we successfully ran six more BTRDA Championship Trials up to the summer break. Not only that but some managed to attract really decent levels of entries, which is very encouraging.

At a recent Committee meeting we had three intelligent points of view each of which had its

merits, and which make for an interesting debate on the future of our calendar. One driver wanted to cut the enormous BTRDA Championship calendar down to something similar to other sports, maybe around half the current number of events, citing the success of the carefully targeted Historic Sporting Trials calendar with only seven events, most of which are oversubscribed, compared to our 22, many of which struggle to break even. countered by a second point of view which preferred a large calendar, at which the driver concerned enjoys competing most weekends in the winter, rather than shopping or other domestic activities on a Sunday. A third view enjoys competing at a smaller number of carefully selected events, but likes having a very large calendar (and geographic spread) to select from, rather than having to do all the events in a small calendar. Personally I favour letting our clubs sort it out between themselves, so market forces determine which are the best events and which others fail to attract enough entries, but this debate will run and run no doubt.

This year the Northern Phoenix club ran the long established Two Day Trial (previously a fun event) as a double header Championship event, combining the previously postponed Jiggers Jug and Raymond Baxter Trials into a double header over the May Bank Holiday weekend, to which

they attracted 24 starters each day. Barry Hogg was the surprise winner of the Jiggers, against formidable opposition, and Peter Fensom took the Baxter on zero points. a rare situation.

Josh Veale started a new club a little while ago, the Midland Trials Car Club. with the aim of restoring some of the classic trials of the past, in the mainly Midlands area. He put together the Spring Trial in mid May, which ran as a BTRDA Championship event at Long Compton, near Banbury, helped by his father and brothers. This was a superb event, but when he announced that there would be just 24 sections we had no idea what he had in store. Each section was at least twice as long as the average, and had a number of stopping points, yet the makers were set wide enough that hitting them was not likely,

a masterclass in setting out. In spite of the dry weather beforehand the sections were really testing, it is hard to imagine a better trial, which fully deserved its huge entry of 32.

After the Lancs and Cheshire Club folded a couple of years ago the future of the long established Derbyshire Trial near Leek in the

Peak District seemed bleak, but Martin Grimwood was determined not to lose this historic event, even though he lives a long way away in North Yorkshire. He persuaded the Airedale and Pennine Club to take it on with his expert help, and, having re-named it the Pennine but using the same old unique

Averillside Farm site it had run successfully since. This year they attracted 24 entries, which is just about enough to break even, and ran a good and enjoyable event.

At the other end of the scale Camel Vale MC ran a small Four Turnings Trial in Cornwall in May and attracted a high class field of just 10 cars, all of whom had an interesting and challenging day.

As for BTRDA results Ian Wright in his own design Sherpa Indy has dominated this year, he won every Championship event bar one (where he came second) that he competed in, an astonishing display of consistency, given the greatly varied weather and terrain we compete on, particularly this year. He also won the Gold Star Final in January just to show his mastery. Looking at the table on the following page I see that he was not alone in being consistent as eight drivers averaged better than 24 (out of 30) points over all the trials they competed in this year.

So, in summary we are managing to survive, and some trials are doing very well indeed, our training days are well supported and produce a few new recruits, our finances are in good shape, but a few of our clubs are struggling to keep promoting events, mainly due to lack of younger recruits to the organising team, but also due to marginal, or worse, finances caused by poor levels of entries. Our Championship is as keenly contested as ever, even though the numbers entering is getting smaller.

From The Hot Seat

Here we are halfway through the season already and there has been plenty of excitement to date. The 2017 Champion, Richard Pinkney, has had a disastrous start to the season with major breakages to the newly re-built Caterham at all but the first round, which has cost him dear. Meanwhile Malcolm Livingston has proved that the Lindsay Special is now well on the pace, despite one breakage at Foxley, and Dave Evans really has the Blitz flying, resulting in 3 second overalls, which has helped him to currently lead the Gold Star Championship. However the man to beat is undoubtedly Dave Mosey in his immaculate new Mini Special, in which he has gained 3 FTDs in 3 outings, although the straight cut box only just survived the Wolverhampton event. Chris Chapman is the dark horse for overall honours now that a Mazda gearbox transplant to the Puma engined Striker appears to have solved the reliability issues.

In the Classes for the first time that I can remember there is a dearth of Minis with Dave Mosey moving out of the Class and Dave Fox experiencing a major engine issue at Silverstone (no not on the Hanger Straight, but at the Boundless by CSMA event, but fortunately Ash Slights returned at Hartlepool so let's hope he does the rest of the season. The saloon car

class is dominated by Mark Thornton and Tom Coverdale, in his first full season, partly due to Warren Gillespie having major mechanical issues (Kelsey assures me that it has nothing to do with her!) which is why they lead the Silver and Bronze Stars respectively. With Richard Pinkney's issues have left the Sportscar class wide open with Ian Chapman taking advantage of others issues, whist John Moffatt, Chris Chapman and Steve Morten battle amongst themselves and Willie Keaning comes quickly to terms with his change to the Striker. In the Specials, as with Gold Star, Dave Evans' consistency has paid dividends whilst Malcolm Livingston and Dave Mosey continue to challenge each other.

As I stated in the Spring News our Championship numbers are down this year, 39 registrations but entries in the early 20s for most events, mainly due to the Club events, which makes the step up to National level a steep one, and the fact that you need to be able to build your own car as it is nigh impossible to buy an Autotest car "off the shelf". With the aim to try and bridge these gaps the Autotest Committee are considering the introduction of a "Roadgoing" Kit Car Class for 2019 to complement the "Roadgoing" Class. The theory being that these should be more competitive

than the Roadgoing Series Production Cars and the owners will have the mechanical knowledge to "move on" into the main Classes if the get the bug. The downside is that it adds another award for the event organisers, but hopefully it will be offset by an increase in entries.

Finally I would remind any latecomers that there is an award within the Bronze Star for the Competitor who does not

qualify at the end of the year, but has the best 4 scores having only competed in 4/5 events. Also don't forget that the Committee are always looking at new events that could be added to our Championship Calendar, so if you have any thoughts let us know. These will need to be

observed before inclusion to ensure that they meet the currently very high standard reached by our organising Clubs, but we are always willing to give assistance if needed.

So which table is the one to follow as an indicator of the Gold Star winner? With only 6 available scores left and the best 7 to count Alastair will really have to go well for the rest of the year. Mr second place man of 2017, Dave Mosey, is the one with the second best score in each but with the aid of the blue mini special Dave may be the one who heads the 2018 table. I'll stick my neck out for Dave M to be the one to put your pennies on down at the local Ladbrokes (other betting shops are available...).

The class positions also show how close things are with none of the major players in the car classes having a perfect score so far and leading their class. This does exclude Dave Mosey but then he has scored both in the mini saloon car class (1 win) and specials class (3 wins). There are odd few with a single or couple of 10's and maybe there could be a second half spurt from some of the 31 points scorers. It's certainly all up for grabs as far as the 2018 awards are concerned.

Bronze Star could also be interesting this year in predicting who is going to be the winner with youngster Tom Coverdale in his 1800 Nova leading the, shall we say more mature, Helen Perren in her Retrotester special at the moment. Both the Nova and the Retrotester are in super competitive classes and it will never be easy for Tom or Helen to get high scores.

AutoSOLOs have seen a boost in championship entries this year with no less than 37 entrants. Is this the change to a regionalised scoring system and a grand combined final event or to the reduced championship entry fee of £5? I expect we will have to do another SurveyMonkey at the end of the year to find out! Having been to guite a few events this year the standard of events is still evolving in the way of classes, layout of tests, penalties and how the results are presented. I have yet to do an event where all times count and I do prefer the system where it is your 2 best scores from 3 runs which count. One of the comments from last year's SurveyMonkey was having the dropped score system meant drivers were driving with reckless abandon knowing they could lose the time. Certainly, haven't seen that occurring at the events I have been to but then we all have our

own opinions. Now, I really dislike being beaten by white MX5's, ok to be beaten by blue or red ones but white ones We have had one cancelled event this season due to the increase in venue costs and I can see this being a foretaste of the future, both for Autotests and AutoSOLOs. Many circuit owners seem to think that all motorsport competitors and organising clubs are all super rich and have been hiking their fees up over the years and have priced more than one club out of running events. One local event has also been cancelled with the

military deciding they want to use the bit of tarmac for training on the day of the event and this will be become more prevalent as overseas bases are closed and the troops relocated to the UK. What is the answer? Please send your replies on a post card (shows how old fashioned I am!).



HONORARY MEMBERS FOR LIFE

DEREK SMITH: Joined the BTRDA in 1951, competing regularly, particularly in Autotests, and won the Flather Star in1963. After three years as Secretary of the Autotest Committee he became General Secretary of the Association from 1967-1982 and was also Treasurer during the same period. As Chairman of the Rallycross Committee from 1976 to 1978, and a Group 1 RAC Timekeeper, he did much to improve the standards of timekeeping at BTRDA Rallycross and Autocross events

PHIL and JANET DARBYSHIRE: Phil and Janet have been actively associated with the BTRDA since the 1960's, and both served on the Autotest Committee and since the Mid. 70's on the Allrounders Committee. Phil is still a member of Council and has served on the Rallycross committee since 1984. Additionally they have been involved in the production of the BTRDA News

BRIAN and MARGARET STAPLETON: Though almost exclusively with Sporting Trials Committee, Brian and Margaret have also served the Association since 1974 with Brian acting as Committee Secretary and Margaret as a co-ordinator for the Sporting Trials Dinner. Both continue to take an active interest in the BTRDA.

MIKE and HAZEL STEPHENS: Mike has been involved in BTRDA activities for over 40 years, primarily concerned with the Production Car Trial committee and was its champion many times over, but also as secretary to the Rallies committee during the period of greatest development of both road and special stage championships. Chairmanship of the Association was taken up in 1982, and only relinquished in 1988 to the more demanding role of General Secretary until 2004. Hazel has been in charge of the organisation of the AGM and Awards Presentation day from 1988 until 2013, and between them, their household has looked after the distribution and posting of News and Clear Round since the early 1980's. They continue to be involved with various activities of the Association.

HOWARD WILCOCK: Howard joined the BTRDA Rally Committee in 1979 and has been involved with the BTRDA Rally Championships since 1987, firstly with the Clubmans Championship, and subsequently the Gold Star Championship, as Championship Co-ordinator. Throughout this period, his wholehearted commitment has been unstinting, his judgement and decisions taken about the format of the championship as a whole have been crystal clear, resulting in the Gold Star Championship being the pinnacle of clubman motorsport. He continues to be involved in the championship, and represents BTRDA on a number of MSA Committees

BRIAN MIDGLEY: Brian has been involved with BTRDA for over 40 years, principally associated with the production car trial world where he was committee chairman, and fierce competitor, for many of those years, whilst he was also responsible for the Association's awards for almost a decade. A constant and authoritative member of Council, he became a director of the Association upon its conversion to a Limited Company, and was subsequently elected as President in 1989. His tenure of that position saw the Association make great strides forward, both in its dealings with the MSA and in the motorsport world at large. His was the greatest contribution in the re-organisation of the Association into Holding, and Operational, companies that exist today.

MIKE SONES: Mike joined BTRDA in 1972 specifically to contest the Production Car Trial Championship, and moved on to the Autotest Championship in 1974. Having been rallying since 1963, he joined the Rallies Committee in 1977 and ran the Road Rally Championship until it's conclusion in 1987. Membership of the Allrounders/NEWS Committee began in the mid '70s, and the organisation of the AGM and Luncheon followed the retirement of Ron Kemp in the mid '80s. He was elected Treasurer in 1982 and served in that role until 1993. The Autotest Committee was joined in 1994, a membership that continues to this day. The Sporting Trials Championship was contested for a few years in the late '90s. In addition, he chairs the Rallycross Committee and is involved in the management of the MSA Asphalt Rally Championship. He was involved in the Association's conversion to a Limited Company, in the formation of the Holding and Operational companies that exist today, and in organising the 60th and 75th Anniversary celebrations. He was elected Chairman of Council in the Golden Jubilee Year of 1988 and continued in that position until retiring in 2014.

BERNARD BAKER: Bernard joined the Autotest Committee, representing event organisers, when Eastern Counties MC won the best event award for their Felixstowe round in 1977. He subsequently became committee secretary in 1980, a role he finally relinquished in 1997. His accountancy skills also brought him to the attention of BTRDA Council, when he was asked to take the role of Treasurer during 1994, a position subsequently confirmed at the AGM in 1995. He continued in the role until the end of 2014, having successfully reported on the financial affairs of both the Holding and Operational companies for 20 years.
