## Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship



Mark Kelly, Neil Roskell and Jason Pritchard Head to Otterburn for Exciting 2021 Protyre MSUK Asphalt Rally Championship Title



Three drivers go into the final round of the Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship aiming to become 2021 drivers' champion – with Mark Kelly, Neil Roskell and Jason Pritchard battling for the title on the Ford Parts Cheviot Stages Rally (Sunday 24 October) over the Otterburn military range in Northumberland.

Mark arrives at the fifth and final round holding a 15-point lead. In his first season in Britain's premier sealed-surface series, the Bolton driver has recorded three second place finishes and a fifth in his Flext-backed Ford Fiesta R5+. He's never been to Otterburn before, and he and co-driver Neil Colman will be looking for another good result to offset the high 25 point that they currently need to drop when the final end of season points are calculated.

Mark currently has 109 points and the most he can finish the season on is 114.

Neil Roskell goes into the final round second in the series after an excellent first season in his ND Civils/Collins Construction-backed Ford Fiesta R5+ which has included a third, fourth and fifth place points finish. His son Daniel is down to co-drive on the Cheviot, but it's more likely to be John Cope on the pace notes. Neil has the most limited experience of Otterburn possible, as the engine blew on his Subaru Impreza on the first corner of the Tyneside Stages! The Blackpool driver has a 12th place point score to drop and is therefore a real contender for the title as he can score big on Otterburn.

Neil currently has 95 points and the most he can finish the season on is 107.

Jason Pritchard is third in the series, seven points behind Neil and 20 points behind Mark. He has more experience of Otterburn than his rivals, having won the previous two Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship titles on the Cheviot.

Having retired on the Hills Ford Three Shires Stages, he and co-driver Phil Clarke have already effectively dropped a score and can add 29 points to their total points tally if they were to win the final round in their North Road Garage Ford Focus WRC05.

Jason currently has 89 points and the most he can finish the season on is 118 – which means that he only has to finish in the top four to win his third straight Protyre Asphalt title.

Other drivers could play a crucial role in the destiny of the title, as happened in 2019 when Alan Kirkaldy/Cameron Fair won the event and Jason Pritchard won the title by finishing third, despite finishing behind title rival Damian Cole on the day.

There is a close battle for the class B14 title, which Adrian Spencer now leads. The RED Industries Subaru Impreza WRX driver, who is co-driven by Rick Sutcliffe, is just one point ahead of Anthony Eaton, who has enjoyed a great season in his Autotest Ford Fiesta R4. Ian Jackson, who has guided Anthony all year, has one hand on the class B14 co-driver's trophy.

Craig Jones will be aiming to bounce back from his crash on the PokerStars Rally. Co-driven by Shaun Layland, the Brecon driver could still win the B14 title, but needs another very good result in his RHL and Jay Jays backed Mitsubishi Evo 9.

## Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship

Ben Crump has a great chance to secure both the Ford Escort Challenge and class B11 titles when he appears in his Coltech Rally Services Escort Mk2. Co-driver lan Beamond was side-lined with tonsilitis on the Isle of Man and hopes to be back in the navigator's seat for the important season finale.

Geoff Glover will be hoping that another good result in his self-built reargive Astra will be enough wheel drive Vauxhall to his co-driver the leaderboard title. Keith Barker tops the going into the final round.

Olly Hunter is new to rallying, but he's already shown a natural turn of speed in his Vauxhall-engined Ford Escort Mk2, most notably by winning the Mintex Award for the best improvement on seeding on the Old Forge Garage Mewla Rally. Co-driven by Jonathon Kennedy, he'll be one to watch as he heads to Otterburn for the first time.

Mark Jasper will be aiming for the class B13 drivers' title, as he and co-driver Don Whyatt contest the event in their Ford Escort Mk2. Andy Brinkley can't win the title himself, but a good run in his BMW M3 could hand Mark Mason the navigators' trophy.

Mark Holmes/Mark Perryman lead the R5 class by nine points after scoring two second place finishes in their **Ford Fiesta** another second would good enough to give them a title.

Stuart Anderson/Kenny Owen have already clinched the Historic class title after a great season in their ex-works Vauxhall Chevette HSR and will be out to enjoy themselves before the winter break.

Protyre Motorsport will take a large range of tyres to Otterburn, including Pirelli, Michelin and Hoosier, and operate an on-event fitting service for all registered Championship contenders.

Special Stage TV will live stream action footage on its Facebook page, with Howard Davies spearheading the commentary team. It will also interview crews during the day, all of which can be seen on its edited highlights programmes.

Organised by Whickham & District Motor Club and Hadrian Motor Sports Club, the 2021 Ford Parts Cheviot Stages Rally (Sunday 24 October) will contain 12 stages totalling 61 stage miles, all held on the Otterburn military range in Northumberland. The event starts on the range at 08.30, with this year's Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally champions crowned at the podium ceremony at 16.45.

## Darren Spann appointed Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship Manager

The BTRDA has appointed Darren Spann as Protyre Motorsport UKAsphalt Rally Championship Manager from 2022, following the retirement of Jane Evans at the end of the 2021 season.

The BTRDA gives Jane a huge thank you for her amazing work over the past four years as she rebuilt the Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship to its current status as the premier asphalt championship in the UK.

Darren Spann's appointment brings a wealth of experience from the world of rallying. Having run the hugely successful Motorsport News Circuit Rally Championship since its inception seven years ago, he has also been Clerk of the Course for the Neil Howard Stages Rally since 2012, turning the event from a single venue stage rally into one of the biggest events on the Oulton Park calendar. Four down, two to go in terms of rounds of the 2021 MRF Tyres BTRDA Rally Series and the situation in the BTRDA Gold Star Championship couldn't be tighter! Having been leading the charge, Garry Pearson/Niall Burns (Skoda Fabia) had an off-day on the Trackrod Forest Stages, allowing George Lepley/Tom Woodburn (Lancer EVOX) to move marginally ahead of them. Ian Bainbridge/Will Atkins (Fabia) led the Trackrod for a while and are still in there fighting, as are Elliot Payne (Fiesta) and winners of the event, Callum Black/Jack Morton (Fiesta). However, having posted two consecutive retirements, the latter have left themselves with no room for error between now and the conclusion of the series...

The first 'result' of the season sees Lepley/Woodburn crowned as Class B13 champions – in what is a very competitive class, their four maximums from four starts cannot be beaten.

The MRF Tyres BTRDA Silver Star Championship has seen different winners on each of the four events but, through it all, Paul Street/lan Jones (Escort) find themselves narrowly ahead of the Avenger of Baz Jordan/Arwel Jenkins. Meanwhile, in the Jordan Road Surfacing BTRDA Historic Cup, the tables are turned with Jordan a solitary point in front of Street! The Escorts of Robert Gough and Owen McMackin claimed top Silver Star points on the Woodpecker and Trackrod respectively, but 2017 Champion Ashley Davies (Escort) and loan Lloyd (Peugeot 208 R2) cannot be ignored!

For their part, Lloyd and co-driver Sion Williams have grasped both the BTRDA Rallye R2 & R2 Junior Cups by the scruff of the neck and, although they're not home and dry just yet, three maximums in each will come into their own once dropped scores take effect.

For the first time ever, a 1400C car took maximum Fuchs Lubricants BTRDA 1400 Championship points on the Woodpecker Stages after all three front-running 1400S crews retired! Adrian & Matt Walk (Ford KA) triumphed on that occasion but then Steve Black/Paul Morris (Suzuki Swift) took their second maximum on the Trackrod and now have leaders Richard Jordan/James Gratton-Smith (MG ZR) firmly in their sights.

With just the Grizedale Stages in early December to go, George Lepley also leads the Motorsport UK 2021 English Rally Championship in association with Seacon UK. It's always possible that he could be caught, but it has to be said you'd get good odds at the bookies!

## BTRDA® Allrounders Championship Supported by Crystal Images

There will be a good number of qualifiers in 2021 and not only that there will be at least 2 qualifiers for the one car award. An even more remarkable fact is that the one car leader, Bob Milligan, in his Mini which he has used for Car Trials, Targa and AutoSOLO, is also in second place overall. The overall leader is still Jamie Yapp who has used the Clio and Nova from the Yapp family garage of cars and also navigated for John Fox (who is in 3rd place) in a Targa rally.

No less than 7 of the 8 qualifiers to date have used the Targa Road Rally Group to score points which shows that the BTRDA initiative to have the championship has been worthwhile for Allrounders. The Allrounders 2021 championship continues until the 31st December so there is still a chance for more drivers to collect points.

Alastair Moffat and Stuart Perren need just one more event and as both are good on the Sporting Trials hills this branch could be a good opportunity. Then, of course, there is the Knutsford AutoSOLO, or the Knutsford Targa – so many choices!

Simon Harris has used the same Golf GTi for his Allrounder single car points that he drove to Gold Medal status in the HERO Le Jog events and becomes the second qualifier in this section. Of interest is that it is the same Golf GTi which came second overall at the very first AutoSOLO at the Aust services back in 2002. In 2021 Simon has had to drive extremely well even to get into the top 5 of the saloon car class. It just shows how AutoSOLO cars have developed over the last 19 years.

There may not be any qualifiers for the under 25 trophy this year. Let's hope that the young Rallycross drivers, and others, will be able to get out and about more in 2022.

### 2021 Season the story so far.....

The 2021 BTRDA Rallycross season is proving to be an epic one so far, with 5 rounds down and 1 to go. The season started at Lydden back in early May with a huge 82 car entry, this was followed up with a 61 car entry at Round 2 at Blyton, Rounds 3 & 4 were at Pembrey in August with 71 entries and Blyton Round 5 with 58 entries proving the BTRDA Rallycross Championship is as popular as ever.

Heading into the final round at Knockhill on October 24th it looks highly likely that Super Modified driver Jason Bleasdale (Vauxhall VX220) will take the overall crown. All he must do is 'start' the event, but as we know anything can happen in Rallycross and there is a gaggle of drivers behind him looking to take advantage should the worst happen.

In Production 4x4 it is former champion Dan Beattie who leads the way, in Production Rory Dening heads the points table and the legendary Vince Bristow heads up the classic category. With Jason Bleasdale looking like he will take the overall crown it is a battle between Fred Ling and Phil Chicken who will pick up the overall Super Modified championship. In Juniors Owen Robbins has had 3 wins and leads the way but is closely followed by Kacper Potyra and Corey Padgett. The Clubman 4x4 Championship only has 3 rounds this year and is headed up by Martin Hawkes who is closely followed by David Bell and Derrick Jobb

- The provisional 2022 calendar has been announced, 8 rounds are planned starting at Blyton on March 27th and ending at Knockhill on October 23rd.
- The new for 2021 Modified category has been a good success and seems to be gaining momentum going into 2022. There are a host of new cars in build including lan Platts, lan Smith and Stuart Hughes planning to race Ford Fiesta MK6s
- The 2021 has now received over 108 championship registrations which is the biggest numbers since the inception of the championship in 1977.

### Demon Tweeks Direct BTRDA® Autotest Championship

### **Testing Times**

At the start of the year there was doubt as to whether we would be able to run a full Championship or whether it would echo the 2020 season of only four events. As it has turned out, although we lost some of the early rounds due to Covid, which were unable to be rescheduled, eight round were successfully completed. The rescheduling of some of the rounds meant that not all our regulars were able to contest a full season, but 28 of our 37 Championship entrants managed to compete in at least one round and most events were well supported.

The final round, held at our sponsor's, Demon Tweeks, Wrexham headquarters and run by the BTRDA Autotest Committee proved to be an interesting experiment in how event might be run in the future. Due to a lack of marshals, the Clerk of Course, Mike Sones, decided to take a leaf out of the AutoSOLO book and split the entry into two (Sportscars and the Rest) with, following the toss of a coin, the Sportscars completing their first 3 runs whilst the Rest (Saloons and Specials) marshalled and did the timekeeping following which the positions were reversed for their rounds. This process was repeated for the afternoon runs.

Admittedly the Sportscars came off slightly the worse for having lost the toss, as the first rounds were rather wet, but in the end, everyone appeared to have thoroughly enjoyed themselves as it gave a chance to observe the other classes, which normally are not seen during the day. Interestingly from an official's point of view the event seemed to run much quicker partly because, due to Covid restrictions, we were using the Marshal's check sheets so did not have to wait for individual timecards and the fact that Competitors chivied each other up and kept things moving.

Having said that we are pleased that eight of the projected eleven rounds ran, this is put into perspective by a recent Facebook post by Alastair Moffatt showing a copy of an advert for the 1969 Castrol BTRDA Autotest Championship (we believe that this was first year that they became Autotests rather than Driving Tests), which featured twenty-three rounds spread though out the country. Worse still is that the Hagley & DLCC event is the only one still to feature in our calendar.

A season report and the Final Championship Results will appear in the next issue.

### The Moffatt Trialling DNA, part 4/4

Alastair - 2021 demon tweeks BTRDA Autotest Gold Star Champion
It is fitting that our final Moffatt in this mini series has reverted to type and earned yet another Gold Star. But that is now, what of the younger Alastair?

Alastair is some 12 years junior to eldest brother Trevor, and his hands-on motorsport started aged 10 with a go-kart, when he competed in 3 races and "did OK". As we read in Part 3, the 2 younger boys honed their slippery condition driving skills on test days at Shenington Kart Track and during this time Alastair passengered for his father on PCT's.

At 16 the star in the making did 3 BTRDA events, the first being Sixty & Worcestershire Motor Club's championship round autotest a week after his birthday, doing "OK" in a standard Escort Mk2 1300 with no diff. Certainly enough to win the Novice award

and not finishing last was another motivational element that hooked the teenager on autotesting. Alastair then started to plan to do the autotest championship the following year.

In the meantime, Alastair double-drove with his father in the Clan to win overall his first trial he drove on and a BTRDA event at that! Then the second event produced another win. Alastair found trials an easy out of the box sport to take up, commenting "but if you sit next to a 5 times champion it is a master class and you spot a mistake and what would correct it".

1995 featured a full Autotest championship year in a Nova, benefitting greatly when he was taken under the Irish wing that had come over to do the championship. 5 coaches plus his dad yielded a class win on every event that year and culminated in the Silver Star win.

During 1996-1999 Alastair campaigned his Mini Special, achieving some ftd's, competing against the Irish who continued to coach him, helping him to eventually win his first Gold Star in 1999 together with the BTRDA Allrounders Gold Star.

There following a period of rallying, competing in the BRC 1400 Class and amassing many stage wins in class but the car's fragility prevented any wins. 2001 was a two-rally event due to foot and mouth before 2002/2003 when the BTRDA Forest Rally Championship beckoned. Now in a Peugeot 106 GTi, multiple class wins ensued and best of the rest many times, headlined with a 16th o/all. The next year Alastair contested the Peugeot 206 Cup within the National Rally Championship but when leading the Cup his campaign came to an abrupt halt after a 6th gear off on the Manx National. Time for a rest.

But many more highlights followed: 2007 Autotest championship "did OK"; 2008 to 2011
Gold Star Autotest Champion; 2009 won every autotest event and had no penalties over the season – "best season!"; and then we find Alastair drawn into the world of stunt driving...

2012 – Alastair's first Guinness World Record, this one for the tightest parallel park, now down to 7.5cm spare gap. Then came the tightest reverse parallel park. With all these acquired skills it is no wonder that the BTRDA Autotest Championship featured again with Gold Star wins in 2015 and 2016. Followed by a lay-off with occasional select events but soon back at the top in 2019.

2020 was the year in which everyone's lives and interests became disrupted, as we well know. Alastair reverted to Car Trials, qualified for the Final and became Silver Star Champion, winning the Final for good measure; all with 5 year old William in the car (not that he weighs much and in the family tradition it's good to start them off young!).

Not that he's counting, but we understand that the foregoing has amassed 9 Gold Stars (plus 1 in waiting), 2 Silver Stars, 70 BTRDA crested spoons and 6 Motorsport UK Championships. Oh! Plus 13 Guinness World Records.

When not competing Alastair has been a super-car engineer and remains heavily involved in stunt driving and car preparation. We asked all the clan about their driving test experiences and Alastair admits that left foot braking probably secured him the fail at the first attempt, but he sailed through on the second.

As for precious cars in ownership, the first Mini Special will never be sold, having owned it since the age of 16, and the family Clan Crusader will also never be sold.

I'm most grateful for the extensive contributions received from Bill, Trevor, Alastair and John and it's fair to say that many of us will have competed against some of them (directly or indirectly) over the years – in my case all of them!

## Honorary Members for Life DEREK SMITH: Joined the BTRDA in 1951, competing regularly, particularly in Autotests, and won the Flather Star

**DEREK SMITH:** Joined the BTRDA in 1951, competing regularly, particularly in Autotests, and won the Flather Star in 1963. After three years as Secretary of the Autotest Committee he became General Secretary of the Association from 1967-1982 and was also Treasurer during the same period. As Chairman of the Rallycross Committee from 1976 to 1978, and a Group 1 RAC Timekeeper, he did much to improve the standards of timekeeping at BTRDA Rallycross and Autocross events.

**PHIL and JANET DARBYSHIRE:** Phil and Janet have been actively associated with the BTRDA since the 1960's, and both served on the Autotest Committee and since the Mid. 70's on the Allrounders Committee. Phil is still a member of Council and has served on the Rallycross committee since 1984. Additionally, they have been involved in the production of the BTRDA News.

**BRIAN and MARGARET STAPLETON:** Though almost exclusively with Sporting Trials Committee, Brian and Margaret have also served the Association since 1974 with Brian acting as Committee Secretary and Margaret as a co-ordinator for the Sporting Trials Dinner. Both continue to take an active interest in the BTRDA.

**MIKE and HAZEL STEPHENS:** Mike has been involved in BTRDA activities for some 50 years, initially as a Production Car Trial committee member and many times PCT Champion. He was Secretary of the Rallies Committee during a period of great development in road and stage championships and he became BTRDA Chairman in 1982. He then took on the demanding role of General Secretary in 1988 through until 2004. Hazel oversaw organising the AGM and Awards Presentation event from 1988 right through until 2013, between them Mike and Hazel's household performed the distribution of BTRDA News for some 30 years.

**HOWARD WILCOCK:** Howard joined the BTRDA Rally Committee in 1979 and has been involved with the BTRDA Rally Championships since 1987, firstly with the Clubman's Championship, and subsequently the Gold Star Championship, as Championship Co-ordinator. Throughout this period, his wholehearted commitment has been unstinting, his judgement and decisions taken about the format of the championship as a whole have been crystal clear, resulting in the Gold Star Championship being the pinnacle of clubman motorsport. He continues to be involved in the championship and represents BTRDA on a number of MSUK Committees.

**BRIAN MIDGLEY:** Brian has been involved with BTRDA for over 40 years, principally associated with the production car trial world where he was committee chairman, and fierce competitor, for many of those years, whilst he was also responsible for the Association's awards for almost a decade. A constant and authoritative member of Council, he became a director of the Association upon its conversion to a Limited Company and was subsequently elected as President in 1989. His tenure of that position saw the Association make great strides forward, both in its dealings with the MSA and in the motorsport world at large. His was the greatest contribution in the re-organisation of the Association into Holding, and Operational, companies that exist today.

MIKE SONES: Mike joined BTRDA in 1972 specifically to contest the Production Car Trial Championship and moved on to the Autotest Championship in 1974. Having been rallying since 1963, he joined the Rallies Committee in 1977 and ran the Road Rally Championship until its conclusion in 1987. Membership of the Allrounders/NEWS Committee began in the mid '70s, and the organisation of the AGM and Luncheon followed the retirement of Ron Kemp in the mid '80s. He was elected Treasurer in 1982 and served in that role until 1993. The Autotest Committee was joined in 1994, a membership that continues to this day. The Sporting Trials Championship was contested for a few years in the late '90s. In addition, he chairs the Rallycross Committee and is involved in the management of the MSUK Asphalt Rally Championship. He was involved in the Association's conversion to a Limited Company, in the formation of the Holding and Operational companies that exist today, and in organising the 60th and 75th Anniversary celebrations. He was elected Chairman of Council in the Golden Jubilee Year of 1988 and continued in that position until retiring in 2014

**BERNARD BAKER:** Bernard joined the Autotest Committee, representing event organisers, when Eastern Counties MC won the best event award for their Felixstowe round in 1977. He subsequently became committee secretary in 1980, a role he finally relinquished in 1997. His accountancy skills also brought him to the attention of BTRDA Council, when he was asked to take the role of Treasurer during 1994, a position subsequently confirmed at the AGM in 1995. He continued in the role until the end of 2014, having successfully reported on the financial affairs of both the Holding and Operational companies for 20 years.

**SIMON HARRIS:** Simon joined the BTRDA in 1994 and has been a member of the Car Trials (formerly Production Car Trials) Committee since 1997, whilst his other motorsport interests include our Allrounders and AutoSOLO championships and the HRCR/HERO Historic Rallying series. In November 2003, when the company restructure took place, Simon was appointed the first Company Secretary to BTRDA Ltd, a position he held for the next 15 years. Alongside this role, Simon took on the now unofficial role of General Secretary, acting as committee secretary to BTRDA Ltd and to Council, together with being a central contact point for the BTRDA brand. Simon finally retired from this position in November 2018, where the breadth of his duties and responsibilities have had to be divided between several other individuals!

**PAT EGGER:** Since the mid 1970's Pat has been an active competitor and organiser. Driving on Autotests, AutoSolos, Car Trials, Autocross events, and co-driving on gravel and asphalt rallies mainly with her husband Richard. In the autumn of 2004, she took over the collation and production of BTRDA News from Janet Darbyshire a role she continued for 16 years until her last edition, the Winter News 2020.
