### SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1 Wolverhampton & South Staffordshire Car Club Ltd will organise a Clubman permit autotest on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

The event will be held at: Stafford Driving Centre, Clanford Road, Seighford, Staffordshire ST18 9QE. Site entrance - what3words: ///insurers.cookbooks.gallons Map reference: 127 869/258

- 2 The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of **Motorsport UK** (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the **FIA**) these supplementary regulations and any written instructions that the organizing club may issue for the event.
- 3 Motorsport UK permit:

4 The event is open to: Registered entrants in the 2022 Motorsport UK British Autotest Championship Registered entrants in the 2022 Demon Tweeks Direct BTRDA Autotest Championship. Registered entrants in the 2022 BTRDA Allrounders Championship Fully elected members of Wolverhampton & South Staffordshire Car Club Ltd. Entry is also open to members of other Motorsport UK registered clubs up to an additional fifteen clubs.

- 5 The event is a round of: The 2022 Motorsport UK British Autotest Championship The 2022 Demon Tweeks Direct BTRDA Autotest Championship. The 2022 BTRDA Allrounders Championship
- 6 All competitors must produce a valid **Motorsport UK** competition licence, championship registration card and/or club membership card.
- 7 The program for the event will be.
  Scrutineering commences at 8.30am.
  Any competitor not signed on by 10.15am may be excluded.
  A drivers meeting will be held at 10.20am
  First car will start at 10.30am.
- 8 The event will consist of six classes as follows:
  - A. Saloon cars under 11ft overall length
  - B. Saloon cars over 11ft overall length
  - C. Sports cars & sports kit cars.
  - D. Specials.
  - E. Road going series production cars\*
  - F. Road going kit cars\*\*

Cabriolets must run in the appropriate saloon car class with roof/hood up, or class C or E with the roof/hood down, as appropriate. All lengths refer to the overall length, which will be determined by the Parkers Car Price Guide (January edition of this year).

All vehicles in Class E & F must comply with **Motorsport UK** Technical Regulations and be taxed for the public road. A current MOT certificate must be produced at scrutineering: exemption can only be given to vehicles less than three years old and then proof of registration date will be required.

\*Roadgoing Series Production Cars – All Saloons, and Sports Cars produced in quantities of not less than 1000 over a 12-month period, are eligible for Class E. All vehicles in this class will be capable of being driven on the road, currently registered (no trade plates), taxed, insured and where applicable in possession of a valid MOT, which will be checked at signing on.

\*\*Roadgoing Kit Cars - Recognized commercially produced vehicle kits, or 'Seven' replicas to 'Locost' specification. All vehicles in this class will be capable of being driven on the road, currently registered (no trade plates), taxed, insured and where applicable in possession of a valid MOT, which will be checked at signing on. Vehicles must comply with the following: Engine/transmission unit: configuration as original but may be repositioned forwards/rearwards; Engine type: free, make & capacity may be changed or modified; Transmission/final drive: all gears to remain in working order, but 'blanking off' on higher ratios permitted by temporary mechanical means; Dimensions: as manufacturer's specification, 'Seven' replicas & 'Locost' types must retain the following minima: 1500mm wheelbase and 3350mm overall length.

N.B. Cabriolets saloons will run in the appropriate Saloon Car class, or Sports/Kit Car class with hood down. All lengths refer to the overall length, which will be determined by the Parkers Car Price Guide (latest edition) for the car concerned or, if not quoted, by the manufacturer's specification. Kit Cars eligible for classes A, B & C and Sports Kit Cars eligible for class C will be as per the approved BTRDA<sup>®</sup> Championship list, which is available from the BTRDA Championship Secretary.

- 9 Awards will be as follows: Fastest Time of Day The Valerie Shaw Memorial Trophy 1<sup>st</sup> in class A an Award 1<sup>st</sup> in class B an Award 1<sup>st</sup> in class C an Award 1<sup>st</sup> in class D an Award 1<sup>st</sup> in class E an Award 1<sup>st</sup> in class F an Award 1st Novice an Award Best BTRDA competitor BTRDA crested spoon 2nd in class (subject to 6 starters) 3<sup>rd</sup> in class (subject to 10 starters) A Novice is defined as having not won an award on a regional or higher status autotest.
- 10 The entry list opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes on **Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> April 2022**. N.B. Entries will be accepted from Drivers without a current full RTA licence provided they comply with the requirements of **M.13**.

Any protests must be made in accordance with section **C.5**. Otherwise, results will become final **30 minutes** after the last competitor finishes the last test.

- 13 Details of tests will be sent out with Final Instructions and printed off by the competitor. Drivers will have at least one run at each test layout.
  Timing will be done manually via **TimingAppLive**.
  The starting signal will be "in own time".
  The order of attempting tests will be at the organiser's discretion.
- 14 Practicing will NOT be allowed (M.6.3.).
- 15 Competitors will be identified by numbers, printed out by the competitor, from a template supplied by the organisers.
- 16 All General Regulations of the **Motorsport UK** apply as written except the following, which are modified:

**M.6.6**. Pylons may be less than 1m in height.

**M.5.1.** Vehicles need not be taxed or registered (except for classes E & F), as the event takes place wholly on private property.

**M.11.3**. A vehicle may be entered twice but must be driven by different drivers.

**M. Appendix 1. Table M.7.c.** (Wrong test) a maximum penalty will be imposed when the route around the markers is not followed as shown on the diagram and / or a line is crossed in the incorrect direction. A test will not be incorrect if the driver realises his/her mistake, goes back to the point at which the mistake occurred and then completes the test correctly as required by the diagram.

- 17 Please make sure that your vehicle is in good mechanical condition, complies with the noise requirements of **J5.17**. and tyre regulations **J.5.9**.
- 18 The use of tyres from section L. lists 1B & 1C are not permitted (M.4.7.).
- 19 Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.
- 20 In the event of a claim having to be made for damage caused to a third party by a competitor, the organisers of the event reserve the right to reclaim the insurance excess under the **Motorsport UK** policy (currently £425.00) from the competitor(s) involved.
- 21 The club would like to thank the landowners for their kind assistance in the running of this event.
- 22 All documentation, wherever possible, will be issued in advance to all competitors and marshals to complete before arriving at the venue.
