His funeral was held on May 9th near Lichfield and a celebration of his life at the wonderful National Memorial Arboretum in Alrewas followed which was only a mile from where Mike lived. The turnout on the day was incredible, with every motor sport discipline represented in great numbers. He would have been amazed that so many thought so highly of him. He was a close friend of mine for over 50 years, and I shall miss him dearly.

Michael was one of the cornerstones of our Association and he will be a very difficult act to follow, so much that already we are having to fill the posts that he held with not just one person, but many. To say that BTRDA will miss him is a massive understatement.

Just a few days ago, I was informed by Pat Baldwin, that Derek Smith had died. Most members will not have met Derek, but you may have read about him as he was featured on the back page of our BTRDA News as an "Honorary Member for Life".

Derek was instrumental in growing the BTRDA throughout the 50s. 60s and 70s. In partnership with President Denis Flather, he ran the Association to the point that in his time as General Secretary (1967 - 1982) the membership grew to well over 1000 members.

Derek was a director of Reckitt and Colman and was able to allow his secretary. one Pat Baldwin, the time to help him in his task of running the Association.



No easy job in those days, for instance the newsletter was produced on a Gestetner machine and individually posted out, something these days would take a few minutes... As a top RAC Timekeeper he helped our sports improve the standards and was a major person in the introduction of Autocross and Rallycross to the BTRDA portfolio.

I volunteered to marshal on two trials on consecutive weekends last month and came back fitter and very tired!

On the first weekend I helped out on the Owen Car Trial in the beautiful grounds of Apley Hall near Bridgnorth. The next weekend I went to Long Compton to the amazing Sporting Trial Festival put on by the Veale family and what a turn out it was, there has never been such a number of Sporting Trials cars competing at one venue I believe.

I was very grateful to the competitors who came back to my hill to help collect the stakes and deliver them to base.

## Demon Tweeks Direct BTRDA® Autotest Championship

#### **Testing Times**

We have had three rounds of the Championship to date: Hagley, Hereford, and Wolverhampton, all at varied and interesting venues. Hagley used the expanse of asphalt offered by Curborough Sprint Course, whilst Hereford returned to the narrow concrete roads of the Foxley Estate and Wolverhampton revisited the Stafford Driving Centre at Seighford, this time using the kart track. All sites have their challenges with the latter two offering courses bounded by grassy banks, which seem to have a magnetic attraction for Autotest cars. Seighford had the added interest of the track having been polished by karting and therefore affording little grip in some areas, however all rose to the challenge of this adrenalin boosting feature.

So, with three events completed Alastair Moffatt leads the Gold Star field by virtue of two FTDs and one third, Willie Keaning is lying second and Chris Chapman third. Toby Cook leads the Silver Star from Joel Conlan and Lee Matthews, whist Sean Kell fronts the Bronze Star from George Harris and Elis Matthews. Toby is fitting his Autotesting around a busy season of mechanicing for Ginetta, BTCC and W Series, so Seighford one weekend and then to Miami and Barcelona before, hopefully, a return to the Autotest paddock in mid-June!

The availability of venues has caused some of our organizers a headache this year with Loughborough CC having to reschedule to September from June and, we are told, that Caernarfonshire & Anglesey MC are looking to move to July from August together with the loss of the Boundless by CSMANE London event in September. The good news is that the Knutsford and District MC have offered to run a replacement event on the 2nd of October at Demon Tweeks as the final round of the Championship and bringing us back to ten rounds.










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## Demon Tweeks Direct BTRDA® AutoSOLO Championship

June is halfway through the year but there are still 10 AutoSOLO events left for competitors to have a go at in order to be the first winner of an AutoSOLO Gold Star. Having competed on the maximum number of events possible Neil Jones in his latest Mazda MX5 heads the points table with 6 scores totaling 177, just 3 short of the maximum for 6 (best 7 scores will count at the end of the year). The update to a Mk3 MX5 version has certainly provided Neil with an advantage which he is using to add to his high level of AutoSOLO skills. Championship newcomer Michael Dolby is currently in second spot overall and managed to beat that man Neil at Ruthin market for the Clwyd Vale event. In third place is past champion Alec Tunbridge in his Caterham 7.

Another new entrant who has recorded some impressive times has been Kieran Belcher driving a Renault Megane R26 in Class C, the turbo putting him up a class when the 1.7 engine capacity factor is taken into account for the 1998cc power unit. It's been top ten scores for the under 25 Kieran and it looks as if he has inherited some of that incredible talent his father had when getting FTDs in his Subaru. Others doing well so far this year have been Gary Ridgeway in his supercharged MX5 and Eddie Martin in another MX5. It has also been a welcome back to Liam Rollings who over the last few years has shown us all the rebuild process for his MX5 on FB. You won't miss Liam as the car is the only bright orange one competing!

## Demon Tweeks Direct BTRDA® AutoSOLO Championship

This year is the 20th anniversary of the first AutoSOLO run by the Bristol MC at the Aust services on the old M4. I must pay tribute to one of the main creators of the sport - Mike Sones. It was actually Paul Parker who was running the MSA National Speed championship who had spotted the activity of Solos in the USA. He had obtained a very good book showing how courses could be designed and other information on car classes.

Thinking that this could be a good starter point for Sprints in the UK the MSA had other ideas and passed it on to the Autotest committee. So, a meeting took place in a Bristol Hotel between Paul, a SW speed competitor with Mike and me representing the RAC Autotest committee. Ronnie Troughton chaired the meeting and guided us on the MSA views with the essence being that events had to be on a hard surface (i.e., not run as an Autocross!), cars to be driven to the event and venues to be contained within a 200m square envelope, as for Autotests.

The events were intended to be an introduction to motorsport with competitors then progressing to either Sprints or Autotests. Mike was put in charge of formulating the rules which were thrashed out at an evening meeting at the Leicester Forrest M1 service area between Mike, myself, and Richard Ineson. It is a fitting tribute to Mike that those rules we agreed upon in 2002 are unchanged in 2022, the only addition being the allowance of passengers and 14-year-old drivers. Thanks, Mike, for your guidance, the sport will remember you with great respect

## MRF Tyres BTRDA® Rally Series







#### WHEN THREE ISN'T A CROWD!!!

Indeed, the more, the merrier!... The first three rounds of the MRF Tyres BTRDA Rally Series have each produced different winners - Stephen Petch/Michael Wilkinson, Matthew Hirst/Declan Dear and Elliot Payne/Patrick Walsh - but, while Petch & Payne also have one DNF to their names and Hirst suffered a challenging day last time out on the Border Counties Rally, Perry Gardener/Jack Bowen have posted three 3rd place BTRDA points finishes to put themselves into the lead of the MRF Tyres BTRDA Gold Star Championship but only just! Two points is all that separates the top three drivers and co-drivers, with the Kielder Forest Rally next on the agenda, followed by a trip to mid Wales for the Nicky Grist Stages.

Similarly, the MRF Tyres BTRDA Silver Star Championship has also seen three different crews on the top step of the podium. Irishmen David Crossen and Michael McDaid came up trumps on the opening two events while Rob Wright/Mark Fisher took the honours on Round 3 which, in spite of a troubled outing on the Rallynuts Stages, sees them as current kings of the 'two-wheel drive' castle. The common denominator with all of the above is Ford – Fiestas for Gold Star and Escorts for Silver...

The Fuchs Lubricants BTRDA Bronze Star Championship is the exception that proves the rule in that only two different drivers have won the category in the three outings to date. Lewis Hooper's Rally First Nissan Micra swept all before it on the Malcolm Wilson Rally but, since then, the Vauxhall Nova of Pete Gorst/Mark Twiname has proved unbeatable – in spite of fuel pump failure on the run-in to the finish of the Border Counties which led to its emotional driver having to push it over the line in Jedburgh! Nevertheless, consistency puts Hooper in charge of both the Bronze Star and MRF Tyres Rally First Cup!...

Returning to the theme of different winners each time out, although Grant Inglis/Gavin Chisholm's Border Counties Rally ended prematurely when their Escort MkII left the road on the second stage, they still lead the BTRDA Historic Cup, but by a reduced margin. Michael McDaid (Escort), Ernie Lee (BMW325i) and Kris Hopkins (Triumph TR7) have also benefitted from maximum points scores along the way. Not to be outdone, the BTRDA Rallye R2 Cup has Yaniv Bar/Osian Owen, Mat Jackson/Sasha Heriot and Tony Simpson/ Ian Bevan (Fiestas) all able to describe themselves as category winners to date, but Bar/ Owen lead their rivals overall!..

Having had a break since the Malcolm Wilson Rally, contenders for the Motorsport UK English Rally Championship, in association with Seacon UK, reconvene in Hexham for the Kielder Forest Rally in mid-June.

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# Autosport International BTRDA® Clubman's Rallycross Championship Presented by Cooper Tires

THE HOME of Rallycross hosted the fourth round of the 2022 Autosport International BTRDA Clubman's Rallycross Championship on May 28th, as just over 70 drivers made the long trip to the south-eastern corner of England at Lydden Hill. Many were eager to try the newly profiled circuit, with the famous Chesson's Drift turned into a steeply banked corner with several possible racing lines and joker laps no longer a going concern, and the new layout met with positive feedback from all concerned.

The biggest entry of the day came from the Melius Ltd Pre-1995 Classic category, including a welcome first appearance of the season from Ray Morgan's Ford Escort Mk3-BDA and the debut of Tony Chrisp's new Vauxhall Nova. There was a familiar look to the top of the heats as Lee Wood's Motaquip Mk2 Escort took two wins and Marc Jones's MR2 the other, while Vince Bristow turned from "Mr Sideways" to "Mr Upside Down" as he rolled his BMW in heat one, but despite missing some glass the repaired car was soon back on track and won the B Final ahead of David Attiwell's Nova with Davy Crockett's Chevette surprisingly missing out on an A Final place in third.

Two favourites hit early trouble in the main event with John Cross's Stratos replica once again struck by gremlins and he failed to get off the start line – further than Morgan got as he did not appear for the race – while Blyton victor Richard Moroney got as far as Dover Slope on lap one before his Escort let him down. Jones led the early going from his usual rocket start until Wood squeezed through at the chicane and won by three seconds to extend his championship lead, Bristow breezing through for third from the back. Attiwell was fifth home behind Jamie McBain who overcame a flapping bonnet and a trailing exhaust on his Peugeot 205, and Paul Pascoe completed the finishers in his Escort having lost out to Attiwell half a lap from home, Chrisp also retiring from the A Final while Dan Swayland (Mk1 Escort) and the Corsa of Tom Edmunds were eliminated in the B, Andy Reed's Corsa dropping out during the heats.



# Autosport International BTRDA® Clubman's Rallycross Championship Presented by Cooper Tires

There was another rollover during the heats for the SG Haulage Ltd Production division when James Ashe upended his Citroen C2. He made it back out, but further issues prevented a final appearance, with Mark Finch (Clio) and Daryl Ambrose (106) also taking an early bath. At the sharp end, there was a welcome maiden heat win for Cai Mainwaring (106) in the opener with Blyton winner Charley Moroney taking the other two. The latter made the most of his pole position in the A Final to take the lead and hold off the repeated attacks of fellow Saxo pilot Charlie Titcombe who was alongside on several occasions exiting the "Talladega banking" at Chesson's. Sadly, the Pembrey winner's hopes were dashed as his Citroen gave up the ghost as the pack ascended Hairy Hill for the final time leaving the young gun thumping his steering wheel in frustration and leaving Moroney to fend off a late stab from the impressive Mainwaring to make up for both a fraught Pembrey and Father Richard's misfortune with the victory.

Behind the leaders, a delighted Tom Brooks completed the podium as he swapped microphone and notepad for steering wheel once more to steer his smart C2 to his best ever finish, while Mark Henry's Alfa Romeo beat Dan Cofield (206) and a slow-starting Karl Jarvis (Saxo) for fourth. Ryan Green celebrated his maiden A Final start with seventh in his Fiesta and John Rook swapped his regular 106 for a C2 and completed the finishers, Dan Pollard (Saxo) another late retirement.

The new FIA Cross Car class made its long-awaited debut with a pair of the intriguing buggies on show, Paul Batson outscoring Luke Holly two wins to one in the heats. Sadly, the A Final turned into something of a no-contest when Batson suffered problems and came to a halt at North Bend on the opening lap, leaving Holly to run solo for victory.

The AS Performance Super Modified division enjoyed a more competitive outing than previously seen in 2022, as Fred Ling finally got his Fiesta ST fully wound up on his local venue. After topping the overall practice times, he won two heats to championship leader Darren Bleasdale's one to beat the Vauxhall man to pole for the first time this year but come A Final time it was a familiar story as the VX220 blasted off into the lead and stayed there to continue Darren's unbeaten 2022 run of victories. Welcome returnee Stuart Emery led the pursuit and was only 2.3 seconds off Bleasdale at flag fall, Ling taking third ahead of Darren Scott's C2.


Reigning category champion Phil Chicken's Citroen was sixth behind Lee Keeler, who was making his first appearance in the BTRDA series since his Production days at the wheel of his smart new Astra VXR. Gary Cook was next home in his Fiesta, while Todd Crooks and Michelle Swallow had repaired their cars following their collision at Pembrey. BMW Mini pilot Crooks spent most of his A Final mired in dust clouds en route to eighth, while the pink Porsche of Swallow was stymied by an opening lap spin and a loose turbo pipe as she finished tenth behind Maciek Florczak's smart Saxo.













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# Autosport International BTRDA® Clubman's Rallycross Championship Presented by Cooper Tires

Another driver hoping to continue an unbeaten run was James Avison in the All Tool UK Modified category, and he started off with a brace of heat wins but was beaten in heat three by Alex Fletcher in the Loughborough College-run Civic. The duo enjoyed a fine scrap in the A Final but in the closing stages Avison ran hugely wide on the exit of Devil's Elbow and came within inches of the tyre wall. Amazingly he kept his foot in and managed to hold his lead, but into the next lap Fletcher pulled ahead and hung on for an overjoyed maiden A Final victory – just reward for his return after receiving the all clear from cancer. Further back, the opening lap saw Allan Laidler's Saxo collide with newcomer David Hughes at North Bend ripping off the latter's Fiesta's front bumper (subsequently run over and smashed by the leaders next time around!) with Laidler recovering to complete the podium.

Championship leader Andrew Hawkes scored a pair of Bone Street Autos BMW Mini heat wins with Nick Abbott taking the other, the latter showing his liking for Lydden as he led off in the A Final. Hawkes reeled him in and eventually squeezed ahead into North Bend, Abbott attempting to fight back until gremlins slowed him on the final lap. This allowed Abbie McGuinness, who had missed the opening two heats while changing her head gasket after a failure in practice, to take second with the disappointed Abbott limping home in third, while Andy Bennett held off the closing Jharek Upchurch for fourth after Wesley Wickens dropped out.

The Ovenden family had been involved in the reshaping of the Lydden circuit through their businesses, but any thoughts that this would give a clear advantage to Will Ovenden in the Cooper Tires Junior class were dispelled as title holder Owen Robbins put up a fierce fight. Ovenden won the battle of the heats two wins to one, but Robbins soon passed the local hero on the opening lap of the A Final and held on until lap three when Ovenden found a gap on the run into North Bend and hung on for his second A Final victory of the season, Corey Padgett completing the podium ahead of Tyler McAlpine. Only four of the Suzukis were present for the main event as sadly problems in the heats meant Holly Woolley was a non-starter.

Chris Baker scored two heat wins in the Cooper Tires Production 4x4s in his Subaru with Tomas Ramanauskas winning the other, and it was the Lancer Evo 4 pilot who edged ahead at the start of the A Final as Paul Davis kiboshed his chances by spinning his Impreza entering Devil's Elbow for the first time. Baker kept up the pursuit and tried an attack out of the final bend from well back only to get loose and take the flag almost backwards in second place, the Lithuanian flags flying for Ramanauskas just as they were at Pembrey. Davis meanwhile recovered for a distant third.

Ramanauskas could not make it two Super Final victories in a row however, as Emery celebrated his return by leading home Scott's C2 for a Super Modified one-two in the final event, Ramanauskas again tailed home by Baker in fourth and fifth behind Wood's Escort. Crooks, Attiwell and Mainwaring completed the finishers, while Bristow and Ling dropped out early on.

The action now moves back north-east to Blyton Park for round five – will Darren Bleasdale extend his overall championship lead with five out of five?

## Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship



James Williams closes in on Protyre Asphalt Rally Championship lead after Jim Clark charge



James Williams has closed to just one point behind Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship leader Ruairi Bell after scoring maximum points on Round 2 of the series, the Beatson's Building Supplies Jim Clark Rally (27/28 May).

Co-driven by Walian Dai Roberts, James set a stunning pace in his Hyundai Power Products-backed Hyundai i20 R5 to score his best result to date in his Michelin-shod car.

Ruairi lost time on the event's opening two stages on Friday night after technical issues in his Pirelli-shod and Inspira-backed Škoda Fabia R5 left him and co-driver Max Freeman languishing down in 12th position. They fought back brilliantly as the event continued in daylight on Saturday, roaring back up the leader board to take second place Protyre Asphalt points and maintain their championship lead – albeit by the smallest of margins.

Steve Wood put in another excellent performance to come home once again as the top non-R5 finisher in his City East Ford Fiesta RS WRC. Co-driven by Dale Bowen, Steve excelled at night and despite a few mistakes in daylight, including a few time-consuming engine stalls, he was delighted to pick up third-place points.

Mark Kelly has also given his Protyre Asphalt title aspirations a major boost with a fourth-placed points finish in his Michelin-shod and Roccia/Tile Master-backed Ford Fiesta R5+. Co-driven by Neil Colman, he struggled to find a good rhythm on the first three stages and damaged the front wing at a chicane, but after that some extremely good stage times were rewarded with his second big points haul of the season.

Jason Pritchard registered for the Protyre Asphalt Rally Championship before the start of the Jim Clark and was therefore eligible to score points. And that's exactly what the three-time champion did, with he and co-driver Phil Clarke enjoying their best run and first finish en route to a fifth-place points finish, despite a slow puncture and windscreen wiper issues in their North Road Garage/Get Jerky backed Volkswagen Polo GTI R5.

Stephen Simpson/Neil Shanks had a great run to a sixth-place points finish in their CA1 Sport-run Tudor Glass Ford Fiesta Rally2.

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## Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship

Neil Roskell's event started with him not putting the bonnet pins in and the bonnet on his ND Civils/Collins Construction Ford Fiesta R5+ flying open on the shakedown stage! Co-driven by Andrew Roughead, he caught a car halfway through the opening stage and was stuck behind it all the way to the flying finish. Whilst trying to regain time on SS2, he skidded into a solid salt box, narrowly missing a rear wheel, and then later in the same stage he hit some gravel and whacked into a chicane, damaging the front of the car. Daylight was much less dramatic and saw a great run to seventh Protyre Asphalt points.

John Stone's Legend Fires Volkswagen Polo GTI R5 won the Dynamic Fluids best-presented car award, which was presented to Paul Megretton who looks after the car. After that great start John and co-driver Laura Connell settled into a fast rhythm and were rewarded with eighth in the Protyre Asphalt series.

Darren Atkinson/Philip Sandham scored their first class B13 and Ford Escort Challenge points after a strong run in their Atkinsons Sandblasting/S&W Fabrication-backed Escort Mk2 – despite, like many, their windscreen getting covered in bugs and insects and creating quite a distraction at times.

Friday's second pass on the Longformacus test was the first time that Lewis Gatt had rallied in the dark – the bumps and associated issues with lights not distracting him too much as he set a good pace. He and co-driver Callum Young then enjoyed an excellent day in the daylight, with the Hoosier-shod Gatt Speed Ford Escort Mk2 driver leading both class B10 and the Ford Escort Challenge after two rounds.

Maximum class points on his 111th Asphalt Championship start sees Geoff Glover take the lead of B11 – he and co-driver Keith Barker enjoying another fast and trouble-free run in their self-prepared rear-wheel drive Vauxhall Astra Mk3.

Gravel pulled out by the cars ahead created problems for Olly Hunter/Jonathon Kennedy in their Vauxhall-engine Ford Escort Mk2, as did some of the tight chicanes. Having retired on the opening round, their first points of the season see them shoot up to second in class B11.

Former B11 class champions Paul and Julian Doroszczuk's return to the Protyre Asphalt Rally Championship began with them understeering their normally aspirated Cosworthengine Drockspeed Motorsport Escort Mk2 off the road on SS2 and getting stuck in a hedge for almost three minutes. Their chances of a full fightback were curtailed somewhat when the last three stages were cancelled before they had the chance to tackle them at speed.

Handling problems prevented Jonathan Stepney from pushing his 1.9-litre engine Griffiths/ Gavin Griffiths Group-backed Peugeot 205 GTi as hard as he'd have liked. Partnered by Aled Davies, the Perth-based Welshman enjoyed a good run and now shares the class B12 lead with Mike Pugsley.

They put medium compound Michelin tyres on for the afternoon and flew over the later daylight stages to also score maximum class B14 points.

Defending class B14 champion Adrian Spencer, who was partnered this time by Ashley Trimble, has taken the class B14 lead after another great run in his RED Industries Subaru Impreza WRX. Paul Kirtley/David Jones survived an early off, which damaged the front of their Subaru Impreza WRC and dented their confidence. They fought back to score their first class B14 points of the season.

A class winning performance by Gareth Bevan/Dafydd Evans in their Blue Sky-backed Ford Escort RS has given the Gareth James Motorsport crew the lead in the Historic category.

Craig Jones/Ian Taylor lost a minute and a half on SS1 when an intercooler pipe burst on their RHL/CMJ Motors Ford Fiesta 4x4 and then retired on SS5 when the rear differential failed

Chris Ford/Matthew Daniels crashed their Ford Fiesta Rally2 on SS5, while Anth Eaton/Ian Jackson also retired their Autotest Ford Fiesta R5+.

William Mains/Emily Easton-Page got caught out on a very fast bump which flicked their WCS/Roy Thomas & Son-sponsored Vauxhall Nova sideways and into a hedge, before rolling and coming to rest upside-down in the middle of the road.

Having won class N3 on Epynt, Johnnie Mackay was looking forward to another good run, this time on home soil. Co-driven by Michael Cruickshank, the reigning Scottish junior champion unfortunately retired his ISS/Kewtech Ford Fiesta ST on the opening stage.

## 2022 BTRDA® Targa Road Rally Championship

Tyres have to be mentioned. This is the area where I receive most communications!

The Championship has tried to include events which adhere to the Motorsport UK Yearbook, with no further tyre restrictions. This should give Competitors consistency throughout the season, not having to obtain tyres for specific events, hopefully reducing costs and making things easier for everyone.

However, some events have to apply tyre restrictions to protect the surface at venues. Venues are under pressure, and we don't want to lose venues. So, there are further tyre restrictions on some events in order to provide a wider geographic spread for the Championship.

Solutions are always being sought for this tyre compromise, it's being worked on, I hope for a more elegant solution for next year's Championship, which should be taking another leap in development in all areas.

We now have a brief lull until the Ystra Targa at Grafton on 31st July, a venue used for Stage Rallies in the past. Regulations will be available soon. This will be the first Targa run by the highly experienced Dukeries team. They've been visiting other Targas to ensure that they meet the standards expected.



### **Honorary Members for Life**

**PHIL and JANET DARBYSHIRE:** Phil and Janet have been actively associated with the BTRDA since the 1960's, and both served on the Autotest Committee and since the Mid. 70's on the Allrounders Committee. Phil is still a member of Council and has served on the Rallycross committee since 1984. Additionally, they have been involved in the production of the BTRDA News.

**BRIAN and MARGARET STAPLETON:** Though almost exclusively with Sporting Trials Committee, Brian and Margaret have also served the Association since 1974 with Brian acting as Committee Secretary and Margaret as a co-ordinator for the Sporting Trials Dinner. Both continue to take an active interest in the BTRDA.

**MIKE and HAZEL STEPHENS:** Mike has been involved in BTRDA activities for some 50 years, initially as a Production Car Trial committee member and many times PCT Champion. He was Secretary of the Rallies Committee during a period of great development in road and stage championships and he became BTRDA Chairman in 1982. He then took on the demanding role of General Secretary in 1988 through until 2004. Hazel oversaw organising the AGM and Awards Presentation event from 1988 right through until 2013, between them Mike and Hazel's household performed the distribution of BTRDA News for some 30 years.

**HOWARD WILCOCK:** Howard joined the BTRDA Rally Committee in 1979 and has been involved with the BTRDA Rally Championships since 1987, firstly with the Clubman's Championship, and subsequently the Gold Star Championship, as Championship Co-ordinator. Throughout this period, his wholehearted commitment has been unstinting, his judgement and decisions taken about the format of the championship as a whole have been crystal clear, resulting in the Gold Star Championship being the pinnacle of clubman motorsport. He continues to be involved in the championship and represents BTRDA on a number of MSUK Committees.

**BRIAN MIDGLEY:** Brian has been involved with BTRDA for over 40 years, principally associated with the production car trial world where he was committee chairman, and fierce competitor, for many of those years, whilst he was also responsible for the Association's awards for almost a decade. A constant and authoritative member of Council, he became a director of the Association upon its conversion to a Limited Company and was subsequently elected as President in 1989. His tenure of that position saw the Association make great strides forward, both in its dealings with the MSA and in the motorsport world at large. His was the greatest contribution in the re-organisation of the Association into Holding, and Operational, companies that exist today.

**BERNARD BAKER:** Bernard joined the Autotest Committee, representing event organisers, when Eastern Counties MC won the best event award for their Felixstowe round in 1977. He subsequently became committee secretary in 1980, a role he finally relinquished in 1997. His accountancy skills also brought him to the attention of BTRDA Council, when he was asked to take the role of Treasurer during 1994, a position subsequently confirmed at the AGM in 1995. He continued in the role until the end of 2014, having successfully reported on the financial affairs of both the Holding and Operational companies for 20 years.

**SIMON HARRIS:** Simon joined the BTRDA in 1994 and has been a member of the Car Trials (formerly Production Car Trials) Committee since 1997, whilst his other motorsport interests include our Allrounders and AutoSOLO championships and the HRCR/HERO Historic Rallying series. In November 2003, when the company restructure took place, Simon was appointed the first Company Secretary to BTRDA Ltd, a position he held for the next 15 years. Alongside this role, Simon took on the now unofficial role of General Secretary, acting as committee secretary to BTRDA Ltd and to Council, together with being a central contact point for the BTRDA brand. Simon finally retired from this position in November 2018, where the breadth of his duties and responsibilities have had to be divided between several other individuals!

**PAT EGGER:** Since the mid 1970's Pat has been an active competitor and organiser. Driving on Autotests, AutoSolos, Car Trials, Autocross events, and co-driving on gravel and asphalt rallies mainly with her husband Richard. In the autumn of 2004, she took over the collation and production of BTRDA News from Janet Darbyshire a role she continued for 16 years until her last edition, the Winter News 2020.
