I'm sure that everyone is rehydrating after the recent Debden Targa, round 2 of the Shepherd Compello BTRDA Silver Star Championship.

Another enjoyable Debden Targa. The weather was warm, the surfaces mixed and the competition close. Moreover, everyone was smiling! 15 BTRDA crews were out on the event chasing Championship points.

Shepherd Compello BTRDA Silver Star Championship:

Past BTRDA Allrounders Champion, John Fox and Simon Phillips now share the lead of the Drivers' Championship, now having scored on the Stu Wood and Debden Targa's, plus Marshalled on the Festival Targa. Simon Bailey isn't far behind with his points from the Stu Wood and Marshalling on the Festival.

Thomas Horst has extended his lead in the Silver Star Navigators' Championship with points from the Stu Wood and Debden Targas plus Marshal points from the Festival.

But with four rounds to count from seven, there's still a long way to go, somebody new could enter the Championship and take the spoils.

Shepherd Compello BTRDA Gold Star Championship:

The Woolleys have leapt into the lead in both the Drivers' and Navigators' Championships, having scored points on every Gold and Silver Star round to date (Gold Star Contenders can score points on up to three Silver Star rounds). Jamie also leads the coveted under-25 Navigators, with no less than nine under-25 Navigators registered for the Championship.

However, dropped scores will kick in. The Championships are definitely not over yet.

David Lobb holds second in the Drivers' Championship in his Vauxhall Adam, developing the car as the season progresses. It's great to see a different car out at events.

The Welsh contingent is led by Huw Morris, but it's expected that both John and Ethan Davies will emerge as the season progresses.

Zak Linham has also been out on every Gold and Silver Star event, with three different drivers! Unfortunately, his run at Debden ended when Bob Milligan's Mini lost drive.

But there are still plenty of events to go.

Aidan Thompson holds third in the Navigators, limited by sickness on the Stu Wood, with many navigators (and drivers) suffering from motion sickness. But no issues at Debden.

By the time you read this the Kemble Targa will have happened. Will there be a change in the Championship tables? There are still many events to go and don't forget your Marshal points. The latest points tables will be available at btrda.com">btrda.com.

Looking ahead, unfortunately, we're seeing events being cancelled and rescheduled due to venue availability. Most are MoD venues which are under pressure due to the World situation. There's not a lot we can do about this, but Championship Contenders will be kept up to date as more information becomes available.

The Championship Regulations have been written to cover these eventualities, however, in the meantime, enter events immediately after entries become available.

Gold Star has been most affected by the loss of the Twyford, Ystra, KLMC and DeLacy Targa's, however, Gold Star Contenders should remember that points can be scored on up to three Silver Star, rounds so there are still choices.

Silver Star events aren't being affected too much by venue issues and a new event has been added – The Bob Budd Memorial Targa at Mallory Park on 15th October.

Events are mainly being affected in the "North". This is a real shame as it means that those in the North are restricted in the BTRDA Targa Championship unless they travel. We need more events above Birmingham, we'd be interested to talk to Clubs about their Targas.

There will also be a BTRDA presence at Rallyday at Castle Combe on Saturday 1st July, do drop by and have a chat.

Just one qualifier so far listed at the time of writing but after next weekend this will no doubt be swelled by the points scorers at the Kemble Targa Rally. So, let's give John Fox all the credit for heading the list through scoring points on AutoSOLOs, a Sprint and Targa Rallies.

That combination of events could be a popular one this year with the current Gold Star champion, Jamie Yapp following the same route. However, for 2023 Jamie may not be going for the one-car Davijon Trophy won in 2022 as already he has scored points in the vintage Nova and the more modern Renault Clio Cup 172, and he will be driving his father's MX5 at the Kemble Targa. At Kemble, he will also be sitting alongside (correction – navigating!) Liam Rollings in his MX5.

The Alwoodley Nic Ayre Memorial Autotests at Acaster had a good entry of 24 including a couple of local, non-Championship, competitors who appeared to have thoroughly enjoyed the day. This time FTD went to Richard Pinkney by 6.5sec from Alastair, who took the Specials class. Warren Gillespie and Stephen Morten (Striker) won the Saloon and Sportscars, whilst Luke Powell (Westfield) won the "roadgoing" class.

Currently, the Gold Star Championship is being led by Alastair Moffatt from Willie Keaning and Stephen Morten, whilst Sean Kell heads the Silver Star from Chris Atkinson (Riot) and Chris Morrison (Nova). Ben Haigh heads the Bronze Star from Steven Haigh and George Harris.

Next up, sees our competitors displaying their skills as part of the Coventry Motofest where Loughborough Car Club will be running their round of the Championship under the arches of the Ring Road.








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Demon Tweeks Direct BTRDA® AutoSOLO Championship

The 2023 Gold Star Demon Tweeks AutoSOLO started on the 12th of March and by the end of May we are by no means halfway through the season with another 13 rounds of possible scoring opportunities. As such it is difficult to offer a considered opinion on the likely hands which will be holding the Gold Star at the luncheon on the 4th of February next year. But here goes for a good suggestion of two driver/car combinations it could be...

The first is a past champion in the form of Alec Tunbridge in his Caterham 7 who has to date scored 4 maximum scores from the 5 rounds so far.

The one event he missed out on was the opening round where current champion Neil Jones in his MX5 pipped him for the top score. Neil couldn't quite keep up the pace at the next 3 meetings. He got caught out by the slippery dust at the Ruthin Cattle Market where Michael Dolby in his MX5 also edged ahead of him.

Mind you, Alec hasn't always been having it easy and at the Boundless by CSMA event at Lymm services in May had to miss a run because of a misfire. Keeping the revs down he managed to finish the event and is now on the hunt for the misfire source. An initial worry of it being a repeat of the ingested rivet problem last year has proved not to be the case so now it is a process of elimination to track down an electric gremlin.

When I saw the regs for the Boundless by CSMA events at Lymm I thought that they had come up with something new for AutoSOLOs. They run up to 12 runs on one test layout with all times counting. 'Not so unique,' says my colleague, Richard Yapp, he did an event at Blackburn with the same set-up many years ago! 'Not so,' said Duncan Wild, the other AutoSOLO subcommittee member, they started doing that last year!

So, a good idea? Maybe not from my personal viewpoint because a) the layout may favour a type of car (fwd or rwd or power) and b) it is always good to be able to drop a poor run score (which then puts more pressure on the remaining runs).

Overall, it is no bad thing to have a variety of event styles in the championship from the 4 tests, 3 runs at each, the worst score dropped on each run which is the predominant format in the events south of Birmingham to the 12 runs at one test and all times counting for the Boundless by CSMA events up north.

Whatever the style of the event, I'm sure it will be the best drivers who will win awards in the championship.

Demon Tweeks Direct BTRDA® AutoSOLO Championship

When formatting the championship for this year, we were keen to add a class for electric vehicles but there was not 100% acceptance by clubs running the events to accept them and so we decided to hold back until more supporting evidence was available.

One important document which has come out since then has been from MSUK titled "Electrified Vehicles (EV) – Guidance for Organizers". Note that Version 6 was published on the 14th of March 2023 and replaces all previous ones – including the very first one when there was a requirement to have 30,000 gallons of water available!

It's very much a simplified list of requirements. It starts off by defining "Electrified Vehicles" as one of 3 types – hybrid (HEV), plug-in hybrid (PHEV) or battery electric (BEV). It then states, "All major manufactures now produce HEVs, PHEVs or BEVs which are eligible to compete in production car classes".

At which point, I will leave you waiting in anticipation as to what follows!

PAYNE EASES...BACK TO THE TOP!

New to the MRF Tyres BTRDA Rally Series last year, the 2022 Brick & Steel Border Counties Rally was won by Elliot Payne who arrived back at the finish in Jedburgh 14s ahead of runner-up David Henderson. Twelve months on, the same order was maintained but the victory margin had been shaved to 8s!

In MRF Tyres BTRDA Gold Star® Championship terms, having set fastest/joint-fastest times on five of the seven stages in the Borders, Payne and Tom Woodburn (Fiesta Rally2) have now claimed the top spot for themselves once again. Joint leaders prior to the start of the event, Arron Newby/Jamie Edwards (Fabia R5) struggled with tyre choice over the early stages but a solid 4th overall sees them now handily placed as runners-up, just four points adrift. With five events still to go and 30 points up for grabs on each occasion, literally anything can happen between now and the end of October – and probably will!

For their part, having held 3rd for much of the day, David Henderson/Chris Lees (Fiesta Rally2) snatched the runners-up spot from Matthew Hirst/Declan Dear (Fiesta R5) with a spirited run through the final stage, Wyndburgh - the eventual margin between 2nd & 3rd places being just 4s!

Russ Thompson/Steve Link (Lancer EVO9) continued their fantastic start to the year with 5th overall and another maximum Class B13 points score. However, on this occasion, Rob Wilson/Richard Crozier's EVO7 was only one place and 20s behind them. A third consecutive finish puts the Escort Cosworth of Ian Joel/Graeme Wood in between the two Mitsubishis in the points at this stage but, doubtless, this saga will 'run and run' as the season progresses!

Although they were absent from the opening round of the MRF Tyres BTRDA Silver Star® Championship, Robert Gough/Paul Morris (Escort MkII) have certainly made their presence felt on the next two! They followed up their maximum scores in both Silver Star and the Jordan Road Surfacing BTRDA Historic Cup on the Rallynuts Stages with a Top Ten finish and a similar tally on the Border Counties. So, albeit with only two scores, Robert – son of five-times Woodpecker Stages winner Richard – and Paul, the Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship Co-ordinator, are 5th in Silver Star and leaders of the Historic Cup. While the spectre of dropped scores is still some way off, when push comes to shove, a few maximums in your account won't do their chances of success any harm at all! However, we mustn't get ahead of ourselves!

Boyd Kershaw/Keegan Rees (Escort) were only a handful of seconds behind Gough/ Morris on their arrival back in Jedburgh and, now with three events successfully completed, lead the Silver Star table. Defending champions Rob Wright/Mark Fisher (Escort) took a class win ahead of Andy Davison/Tom Murphy (Sunbeam VXR) who, along with Neil Andrew/Dom Adams (Escort), have maintained a 100% finishing record and are just two and eight points respectively adrift of the leaders.

Liam Clark/Ben Wild are sandwiched between the Escorts of Andrew/Adams and Gough/Morris but, with one eye on Silver Star, they also lead the BTRDA Rallye R2 Cup in their Fiesta. Tony Simpson/Stefan Arndt (Fiesta) claimed the R2 spoils in the Borders from Clark/Wild and Alfie Hammond, while the Opel Adam of erstwhile leaders Robert Proudlock/Steven Brown succumbed to electrical problems.

As mentioned above, Robert Gough/Paul Morris lead the BTRDA Historic Cup by a single point from Ben Friend/Cliff Simmons whose own Escort held that exalted position prior to the start of the Border Counties. However, according to the official results, the car finished 'on side' – which is probably easier to explain to the uninitiated than 'off side'! – on the penultimate stage of the day. Whatever, it was to go no further.... Ernie & Karen Graham's Escort RS1600 came away with maximum H1/H2 points, leaving them within touching distance of the overall leaders and ideally placed to benefit from any untoward occurrence that may beset them in the future!

Liam Clark earned top billing in the BTRDA Rallye R2 Junior Cup which he now leads from Alfie Hammond, with Robert Proudlock's Opel Adam demoted to 3rd. However, the Dumfries driver has scored maximums on each of the events he has finished, so, it's safe to say that this isn't over yet either!

Husband-and-wife crew Nigel & Kaz Jenkins kept up the pressure in the Fuchs Lubricants BTRDA Bronze Star Championship by guiding their Nova to maximum points on the Border Counties. So, that's three events – two firsts & one second place – not quite a full-house, but the next best thing!













Runners-up on the day were Chris & James Greenall in another Nova and, making it a Vauxhall 1-2-3, Will Banks' 1400C car was 3rd. Paddy Homan's Puma was next, pipping the MG ZR of Luke Watts/Matt Rogers by just two seconds – a result that sees Luke move up to 2nd in the overall 1400 Championship, right behind his mum!

After the third round of the MRF Tyres Motorsport Trophy, Ian Joel (Escort Cosworth) retains his position at the top of the table but has Colin Minton (Fiesta R5) and Alfie Hammond (Fiesta R2) snapping at his heels.

Having found himself as joint leader – along with four others – of the MSUK English Rally Championship, in association with Seacon UK, after the opening encounter, Elliot Payne (Fiesta Rally2) has wasted no time in claiming the spot for himself on the second event, the Brick & Steel Border Counties Rally. OK – so he won it outright but even so, in a class-based series such as this, vehicles of all capacities have the wherewithal to establish supremacy. The fact that Nigel Jenkins' 1400cc Nova is Elliot's nearest rival would, in no small way, go to illustrate this!

The next outing for English Championship contenders will be the Hexham-based Kielder Forest Rally in mid-June. Elliot Payne won here in 2022 as well but will he be able to maintain his advantage?

NEW COOPER TIRES RALLY RANGE



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Autosport International BTRDA® Clubman's Rallycross Championship Presented by Cooper Tires

Round 2 - Pembrey

The traditional early season doubleheader in South Wales for the Autosport International BTRDA Clubmans Rallycross Championship saw just shy of 50 cars present at Pembrey across eight classes for Round Two of the series on Saturday, windy and damp conditions greeting the slightly smaller than usual field.

Defending **Melius Ltd Pre-'95 Classic** champion Lee Wood is certainly staking a claim for the overall title this year with a very rapid performance in both opening rounds, but the Motaquip Escort had to share the heat wins at Pembrey with John Cross's Stratos replica and Jamie McBain who had happily rebuilt his Peugeot following his Blyton inversion. Wood however dominated the A Final to make it a double for the season with McBain and Cross his placemen, while it was good to see veteran Allan Tapscott back out in a Mk2 Escort and he took fourth. Ryan Stuchbury's 205 was fifth after a scrap with Daryl Ambrose's 106 ended when the latter spun, rejoining to finish seventh behind Dan Swayland's smart Mk1 Escort, while Helen Crooks' Mini completed the finishers. David Ewin meanwhile was sadly forced out in the heats after the Fiesta Evo broke its steering rack.

Fred Ling is also a potent challenger for the overall crown in the **SG Haulage/Rotec Super Modified** class, the Fiesta pilot taking two heat wins with Todd Crooks scoring his first success of the year in the other. Crooks however was stymied by a broken CV joint on his BMW Mini in the A Final as Ling dominated for his second A Final win of the season, Gary Cook enjoying a change of fortune to make it a Fiesta one-two and Phil Chicken (Citroen C2) topping a rather bruising battle with a very sideways Chris Smith (Civic) for third. James Avison in another Civic was the final finisher, while Michelle Swallow's Boxster broke its gearbox in heat one, leaving her team to purchase a similar Porsche locally which was subsequently cannibalised for a replacement box for day two!

Another driver to score an A Final double was Martin Peters in the **MOT Group Production** category, the Saxo pilot winning one heat to Honda man Alex Fletcher's two before leading in the main event despite late pressure from Stuart Woollen who took his best-ever result in the R1 Motorsport Peugeot 106. Despite feeling under the weather Mark Henry passed Fletcher for third in his Alfa Romeo, the Modified champion then dropped to fifth by a track limits penalty behind James Ashe's C2, newcomer Kestutis Butkus (Swift) the final finisher.

Abbie McGuinness topped the qualifiers in the **Bone Street Autos BMW Minis** with two heat wins to Dave Ellis's one, but from the outside of the front row young gun Ben Sayer made the best start in the A Final and led all the way for his maiden success in the category, Ellis second and with round one winner Charley Moroney absent taking the provisional championship lead. McGuinness made up for a slow start by holding off Harvey Harman for third with Leigh-Ann Sedgwick fifth after missing two heats with power steering problems, while James Hawkes was an early retirement.

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Tyler McAlpin scored two **AVM Motors Junior Rallycross** heat wins to Blyton winner Will Ovenden's one and the former led in the A Final to make it 1-1 on round wins for the season. Corey Padgett chased hard early on but dropped back in the closing stages, while lone non-Suzuki man Jimmy Jeakins took fourth in the Micra rebuilt after its Blyton rollover ahead of Ben Bartlett and newcomer Teddie MacPherson.

The heat wins were split three ways in the **SGS Gases FIA Cross Cars** with Blyton victor Will Butler, David Attiwell and Luke Holly taking one apiece, and after a jumped start saw the latter moved to the back of the grid for attempt two it was Attiwell who outdragged Butler off the line and led all the way to follow up his 2022 Knockhill success. Paul Batson held off Holly for third, the former causing some amusement when he failed to see the chequered flag and continued for an extra lap, while newcomer Ethan Rouse completed the finishers.

The two 4x4 classes ran combined, welcome returnee Andy Grant winning two **Cooper Tires Clubman 4x4** heats in his famous Focus and taking the A Final despite a close challenge from heat three winner Roger Thomas in his lurid Fiesta. Michael Boak was another welcome entry in his Skoda Fabia but he dropped back as the A Final went on and was almost caught by the **MacG Racing Modified 4x4** duo of Tomas Ramanauskas and Chris Baker, the former taking the class victory in his Mitsubishi over Baker's Subaru having outqualified his rival two heat wins to one.

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Autosport International BTRDA® Clubman's Rallycross Championship Presented by Cooper Tires

Round 3 - Pembrey

Round Three of the Autosport International BTRDA Clubmans Rallycross Championship dawned in similar conditions to the first day of the Pembrey weekender, a slightly reduced entry ready to do battle after some problems in Round Two for a few teams.

There was no let-up in the **Melius Ltd Pre-'95 Classic** division for the dominant Escort of Lee Wood, this time scoring a faultless maximum of three heat wins and the A Final to complete a hat trick of Round wins for the year so far. Jamie McBain's Peugeot followed him home in all four races with the Stratos clone of John Cross again completing the A Final podium, while Ryan Stuchbury (205) and Dan Swayland (Mk1 Escort) completed the finishers after an impact with a tyre stack broke the steering in Daryl Ambrose's 106. A similar collision with a tyre stack in heat three sadly saw Mini pilot Helen Crooks suffer a broken wrist, while Allan Tapscott's Escort broke down in heat one and was out for the day and David Ewin was unable to run after the Fiesta Evo broke its steering rack in Round Two.

Things did not get better for the Crooks family in the **SG Haulage Super Modified** category, as heat one winner Todd Crooks (BMW Mini) tangled with Phil Chicken in heat three and both were launched into a rollover. Chicken resurrected his Citroen for the A Final but expired in a cloud of smoke on the last lap as double heat winner Fred Ling (Fiesta) made it a hat trick for the season to stay level with Lee Wood at the top of the overall points. Chris Smith took second in his Civic with fellow Honda man James Avison fourth behind Michelle Swallow, the Porsche pilot rewarding her team's efforts to buy a roadgoing Boxster and transfer its gearbox into her race car after a failure in Round Two by scoring her best ever result. Gary Cook (Fiesta) meanwhile also dropped out in the heats.

Martin Peters' unbeaten run in the **MOT Group Production** class came to an end as defending Modified champion Alex Fletcher scored a heat and Final double in the Loughborough College Honda, heading home Stuart Woollen who had won heat one in the R1 Motorsport Peugeot. Mark Henry's Alfa was next home with Peters having to settle for fourth after issues with his Saxo throughout the day, while heat three winner Dan Griffiths (C2) was next ahead of the similar mount of James Ashe and Kestutis Butkus's Swift. Defending champion Charlie Titcombe (Saxo) was meanwhile excluded for a camera infringement.

MacG Racing Modified 4x4 had just one entry in the shape of Tomas Ramanauskas with Chris Baker's Subaru not appearing for the second day of the weekend, the Mitsubishi pilot electing to run in with the Production class for the day. **Cooper Tires Clubman 4x4** saw all but one car present in Round Two suffer problems and not return on Sunday, with Andy Grant electing not to run alone as a result leaving the class in absentia.

There was a heat and an A Final double for Abbie McGuinness in the **Bone Street Autos BMW Minis** to boost her title hopes, fellow heat winner Ben Sayer following her home after a scrap with Round Two victor David Ellis while Harvey Harman was further back in fourth. Leigh-Anne Sedgwick's car let her down while well-placed, while Gus Glass and James Hawkes failed to start the main race.

Pre-event favourites Will Ovenden and Tyler McAlpin shared the **AVM Motors Junior Rallycross** heats two to one, the former overturning Round Two's result as he held off McAlpin to win the A Final. Corey Padgett chased initially but dropped back into the clutches of newcomer Ben Bartlett who just failed to catch him for third, Teddie MacPherson and Jimmy Jeakins completing the finishers.

There was a welcome first win for Ethan Rouse in heat two of the **SGS Gases FIA Cross Cars**, the other heats going to Will Butler and David Attiwell. The former made it a double in the A Final with Luke Holly just defeating Rouse for second, Attiwell dropping back into fourth as the race progressed while Paul Batson failed to start.

Despite the somewhat thinner than usual field the drivers still did their best to entertain, and a few have some repair work to do ahead of Round Four at Blyton Park on July 2nd. Get well soon to Helen Crooks after her injury, and we hope to see her and her son Todd back out in Lincolnshire.

Important Tyre Information for 2023 and beyond

Mid way through the 2023 season we shared some important information with regards to Cooper Tires entering a consultation process, the potential closure of the Melksham production site and the ceasing of all Motorsport supply and activity for all AVON/Cooper Tires.

This process has now concluded and sadly it does mean that the Melksham production site will close and with it all supplies of AVON/Cooper tires will cease. This is a huge loss for Rallycross and Motorsport as a whole, the total supply of tyres for just rallycross is around 180,000 annually and will leave a huge void in the supply of tyres for Rallycross.

This does mean that, like many other Championships currently serviced by Cooper/AVON Tires, we will be speaking with alternative tyre suppliers for the 2024 season and beyond.

2024 and beyond:

The BTRDA Rallycross Committee are currently finalising plans for tyre supply from 2024 and beyond. At this stage, the aim is to fill commercial gap created by the loss of Cooper whilst ensuring all our competitors have a supply of tyres for their vehicles from 2024. With the total loss of both Cooper and AVON tires after 31/12/2023 it's vital we arrange a replacement.

Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship



No clear favourite emerged in the ultra-close battle for the 2023 title



There have been four different winners from the first four rounds of this year's BTRDAorganised Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship, setting the UK's premier sealed-surface series up for an exciting second half of the season.

David Henderson won the opening Reed Group East Riding Stages in his Keco/PAR Petroleum-backed Ford Fiesta Rally2, although he and co-driver Chris Lees dropped to 17th after electing to miss the double header Manx National – but are now right back in contention, having finished second last time out on Round 4.

David Wright/Paula Swinscoe took home maximum points at the end of day one on the Isle of Man (Round 2) in their Fix Auto/Grove Hill Garage Ford Fiesta R5, while Callum Black/ Jack Morton honoured their promise to take overall victory on the Manx (on Black's first asphalt rally for 10 years) to score maximum points on day two (Round 3) in their Pallas Connections Ford Fiesta Rally2.

James Ford/Neil Shanks then scored maximum points in Round 4 of the Protyre Asphalt Championship, the most recent Beatson's Building Supplies Jim Clark Rally. Even though it was also a round of the British Rally Championship, they set a string of fastest overall stage times to finish fourth overall in their Citroën C3 Rally2.

But standing on top of the Protyre Asphalt leaderboard after four rounds are Neil Roskell/ Andrew Roughead. The Blackpool driver has been the measure of high-speed consistency this year in his ND Civils/Burdens/Witham Motorsport Ford Fiesta Rally2 – give or take a few moments, like ploughing through a field on the East Riding – and with two podium finishes to his name leads the overall drivers' standings, 17 points ahead of Black and Wright, who are tied for second.

Like Henderson, there are lots of drivers further down the points table who have already dropped two rounds and from now on can count every point they score – putting them in a potentially very strong position for the title and the coveted BTRDA Gold Star award. These include the defending champion Steve Wood (Trailhead Get Jerk Ford Fiesta WRC), Wayne Sisson (AMS Arnside Motorsport Mitsubishi Evo 10), Kevin Davies (Cobra Hydraulics Volkswagen Polo GTI R5), Hugh Hunter (RSH Tarmac Ford Fiesta Rally2) and James Ford.

Others only have a single point to drop, having started but not finished either one or two rounds. These include John Stone (Legend Fires Volkswagen Polo GTI R5), Stephen Simpson (Tudor Glass Ford Fiesta Rally2) and David Wright.

Hugh Brunton (Škoda Fabia Rally2) and Robert Swann (Ford Fiesta WRC) have missed three rounds, making their title hopes a bit more of an outside bet, but their speed on the respective Jim Clark and East Riding rallies suggests that they are more than capable of winning events and influencing where the title will go – just as other drivers have done in recent years.

One of the stars of this year's Protyre Asphalt Championship has been Will Hill/Richard Crozier in their Hills Ford Fiesta Rally3. They lead class B14, but their incredible overall results puts Hill fourth in the overall drivers' table, showing what a well-driven M-Sport-built four-wheel drive 1.5 litre EcoBoost engined 215bhp Fiesta Rally3 can achieve.

Other class leaders include Darren Atkinson/Mark Twiname, who continue to score outstanding overall results in their rapid Haldane Fisher Ford Escort Mk2.

Will Rowlands/Emyr Hall have netted four maximum class H9 scores to be the best Historic car crew in their Escort RS1800 Mk2. They also lead the BTRDA Historic Asphalt Cup and the Ford Escort Challenge.

Mark and Andrew Constantine lead class B9 in their CBS Vauxhall Corsa, Lewis Gatt heads class B10 in his Gatt Speed Ford Escort Mk2 and Michael Harbour/Ian MacDougall top class B11 in their VS Pro Pressure Washing Services/Miller Waste Water Escort Mk2.

The reigning Northern Ireland Junior rally champion Sam Adams leads the Fuchs Lubricants/
OnThePaceNote supported Protyre Asphalt Junior class in his Road & Rally Services Ford
Escort Mk2 – but is only nine points ahead of Archie Swinscoe, who leads class R2 in his
Rallytech Composites/Asset Alliance Group Opel Adam.

Honorary Members for Life

PHIL and JANET DARBYSHIRE: Phil and Janet have been actively associated with the BTRDA since the 1960's, and both served on the Autotest Committee and since the Mid. 70's on the Allrounders Committee. Phil is still a member of Council and has served on the Rallycross committee since 1984. Additionally, they have been involved in the production of the BTRDA News.

BRIAN and MARGARET STAPLETON: Though almost exclusively with Sporting Trials Committee, Brian and Margaret have also served the Association since 1974 with Brian acting as Committee Secretary and Margaret as a co-ordinator for the Sporting Trials Dinner. Both continue to take an active interest in the BTRDA.

MIKE and HAZEL STEPHENS: Mike has been involved in BTRDA activities for some 50 years, initially as a Production Car Trial committee member and many times PCT Champion. He was Secretary of the Rallies Committee during a period of great development in road and stage championships and he became BTRDA Chairman in 1982. He then took on the demanding role of General Secretary in 1988 through until 2004. Hazel oversaw organising the AGM and Awards Presentation event from 1988 right through until 2013, between them Mike and Hazel's household performed the distribution of BTRDA News for some 30 years.

HOWARD WILCOCK: Howard joined the BTRDA Rally Committee in 1979 and has been involved with the BTRDA Rally Championships since 1987, firstly with the Clubman's Championship, and subsequently the Gold Star Championship, as Championship Co-ordinator. Throughout this period, his wholehearted commitment has been unstinting, his judgement and decisions taken about the format of the championship as a whole have been crystal clear, resulting in the Gold Star Championship being the pinnacle of clubman motorsport. He continues to be involved in the championship and represents BTRDA on a number of MSUK Committees.

BRIAN MIDGLEY: Brian has been involved with BTRDA for over 40 years, principally associated with the production car trial world where he was committee chairman, and fierce competitor, for many of those years, whilst he was also responsible for the Association's awards for almost a decade. A constant and authoritative member of Council, he became a director of the Association upon its conversion to a Limited Company and was subsequently elected as President in 1989. His tenure of that position saw the Association make great strides forward, both in its dealings with the MSA and in the motorsport world at large. His was the greatest contribution in the re-organisation of the Association into Holding, and Operational, companies that exist today.

BERNARD BAKER: Bernard joined the Autotest Committee, representing event organisers, when Eastern Counties MC won the best event award for their Felixstowe round in 1977. He subsequently became committee secretary in 1980, a role he finally relinquished in 1997. His accountancy skills also brought him to the attention of BTRDA Council, when he was asked to take the role of Treasurer during 1994, a position subsequently confirmed at the AGM in 1995. He continued in the role until the end of 2014, having successfully reported on the financial affairs of both the Holding and Operational companies for 20 years.

SIMON HARRIS: Simon joined the BTRDA in 1994 and has been a member of the Car Trials (formerly Production Car Trials) Committee since 1997, whilst his other motorsport interests include our Allrounders and AutoSOLO championships and the HRCR/HERO Historic Rallying series. In November 2003, when the company restructure took place, Simon was appointed the first Company Secretary to BTRDA Ltd, a position he held for the next 15 years. Alongside this role, Simon took on the now unofficial role of General Secretary, acting as committee secretary to BTRDA Ltd and to Council, together with being a central contact point for the BTRDA brand. Simon finally retired from this position in November 2018, where the breadth of his duties and responsibilities have had to be divided between several other individuals!

PAT EGGER: Since the mid 1970's Pat has been an active competitor and organiser. Driving on Autotests, AutoSolos, Car Trials, Autocross events, and co-driving on gravel and asphalt rallies mainly with her husband Richard. In the autumn of 2004, she took over the collation and production of BTRDA News from Janet Darbyshire a role she continued for 16 years until her last edition, the Winter News 2020.
